#### **Certified Seed Potato** List Now Available To Growers

A complete list of all potato fields in the Province which have met standards of Foundation. "A" and certified seed grades has been prepared and copies are available without charge. The list gives growers' names and addresses together with varieties, acreage and grade standing.

Application for copies of the list should be made to local Agricultural Representatives, offices of Dominion Seed Potato Certification Service, or to the Crops, Seeds and Weeds Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture, Parliament Buildings, Toronto.

Many growers and buyers consider it good business management to make provision for supplies of high quality seed during fall and winter months. As a result information which the list contains is usually much in demand at this
