develops because of lack of proper cooling of freshly separated cream. Many producers assume that cold air in winter is sufficient to cool cream, and do not use cold water for quick-cooling. Because of slow-cooling, bacteria growth continues quite rapidly and this results in rapid "aging" of the cream.

**From The Ontario Dept. of Agriculture**

More and more creameries are increasing the premium paid for first grade cream over second grade, an official of the Dairy Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture, said a few days ago. The majority are now paying a premium of five cents per pound butterfat while others have increased their premiums to an even eight and in some cases ten cents. A small few are still at the minimum of three cents a pound butterfat, the amount permitted under the Dairy Products Act.

Creameries are now realizing that poor quality cream, which produces low-grade butter, actually brings a liability. High quality cream, it is pointed out, is an asset to both producer and creamery.

Those plants which have low quality, second-grade butter, or third or lower grade product, are finding it increasingly difficult to locate a market for low grades at any price. On the other hand producers of high-grade butter are not experiencing any difficulty in disposing of it at ceiling prices.

Department instructors report cream quality received at creameries during January averaged slightly more than four per cent second grade. Over the entire province the quality varied from a low of less than one per cent to a high of over nine per cent.

Chief flavor defects, causing second grade cream, are reported to be of a stale, unclean, metallic, bitter and stable nature with stale flavor most prevalent.

Department inspectors state that to the average person staleness seems to indicate a flavor developed because of age. In the case of second grade cream this is partly because cream is not gathered as frequently in winter as during the summer months. However, it has been found that its stale flavor
