THE MIXING BOWL

Hello Homemakers! There may be many ways to serve fish, but made in aluminum foil will suit me anytime. The main reason is perhaps the good flavour we get when we seat it at the table in preference to the aroma in the house at bed-time—whenever fish is fried. Fish is really steam-cooked when you wrap it in cookery parchment foil or paper so you do not see any brownness but we smother it with egg or tomato sauce anyway.

Leftover fish makes a favourite dish in the form of cakes or loaf. You combine cooked fish and mashed potatoes well, beating until fluffy and free from lumps. Then chill the mixture until it can be handled easily when shaping into cakes. Use only sufficient fat to cover the bottom of the frying pan. When you look over our recipe you will see that fish cakes are easy to make. And if you make your meal preparations well in advance the patties are better. They may be mixed in the morning, covered and set in the electric refrigerator. Then at dinner time they can be cooked in 8 minutes. Even the sauce to serve with them may be cooked in advance and reheated while the cakes are browning.

Baked Stuffed Fillets
Dip 2 large fillets in salted milk (1 tablespoon salt to 1 cup milk). Place on oiled aluminum foil in a shallow baking dish. Cover each fillet with stuffing made as follows: Mix 4 cups soft bread crumbs with 1 cup chopped celery, 3 tablespoons chopped onion, 2 tablespoons melted butter or shortening, 3 tablespoons chopped parsley, ½ teaspoon savory seasoning and ½ teaspoon salt.
Dip 2 more fillets in salted milk and place on top of the stuffing. Wrap paper over fish. Bake in very hot electric oven (450 degrees) for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 400 degrees and bake 25 minutes longer. Serve with tomato sauce or egg sauce. Yield: about 8 servings.

Egg Sauce
3 tablespoons butter or shortening
½ teaspoon dry mustard
1½ cups milk
3 tablespoons flour
¼ teaspoon salt
2 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
Melt butter or other fat in top part of double boiler. Add flour, mustard and salt and blend. Add milk and cook over hot water, stirring constantly until thick. Add chopped hard-cooked eggs. Serve hot with fish cakes.

Quick Tomato Sauce
2 tablespoons fat
2 tablespoons chopped green celery
1 can condensed tomato soup
2 tablespoons chopped onion
¼ cup water
½ teaspoon chili powder or a few drops tobasco sauce
Melt fat in heavy saucepan or frying pan. Add onion and green celery. Cook gently for 3 minutes. Do not let onion become too brown. Add water and simmer gently for 5 minutes. Add tomato soup and chili powder or tobasco. Heat and serve.

Fish Cakes
2 cups cooked fish
2 cups mashed potatoes
1 beaten egg
1 tablespoon margarine
salt and pepper
milk
To the fish, add the mashed potatoes which have been prepared as for the table use. Add beaten egg, melted butter and salt and pepper to taste. Add a little milk if the mixture is too dry. Shape into flat cakes, place in greased pan and brown in skillet pan—about 8 minutes. Serves six.

Water may boil too fast, pan may be too thin, or salt will cause eggs to stick. Salt when you cover them and set off the element to cook slowly.

Municipal Subsidy Out New Grants Promised

The Ontario Government will discontinue the one-mill subsidy paid to municipalities since 1937, and substitute other grants that will cost the government three million dollars more, Provincial Treasurer Leslie Frost announces. The new grants will come to places like Stouffville and Markham villages on a percentage basis of what is paid by these places for police protection, and for fire protection, and roads, also probably something by way of lower county tax if the County sees fit to pass it on. The thing is still in a hazy stage. We hear the village road grants will be on a 50-50 basis same as is given townships.

No municipality will receive less than the equivalent of the one-mill payment based on 1948 assessments, Mr. Frost said in his budget address to the legislature. If their new grants fall short the government will pay the difference.

Municipalities had objected to the one-mill subsidy which for the present fiscal year will total \$3,325,000. The new plan calls for payments totalling \$6,300,000. Each municipality will receive a percentage of the cost of operating its municipal fire and police departments, based on population and cost for the year preceding the year of the grant. In the case of fire departments this will amount to a total of \$1,500,000 and police departments, \$1,600,000.

The governments will pay municipalities half the cost of maintaining municipal homes for the aged, estimated at \$200,000; half the cost of constructing new municipal homes, \$850,000; and 25 per cent of the municipality's statutory liability for wards of children's aid societies, \$800,000.

The government will pay children's aid societies 25 per cent of any amounts raised by private subscription. Cost is estimated at \$200,000.

Under present legislation municipalities receive half the cost of road expenditures. In the case of cities and separated towns and smaller Northern Ontario centres, expenditure for the grant is restricted to two mills on the assessment. In the case of a town or village in a county it may not exceed twice the amount of the county road levy for the previous year.

New legislation will remove the restrictions and provide for the payment to a city or separated town of 33 1-3 per cent of all approved road expenditures and 50 per cent to every town or village in a county.

Municipalities had objected to the one-mill subsidy because assessments varied.

Municipalities had also argued that the Ontario government should assume the entire cost of social services. The government had already assumed "a major portion" of these costs. To assume them all would be "to deprive the people of the value of administration at the municipal level where certain matters can be dealt with more effectively."

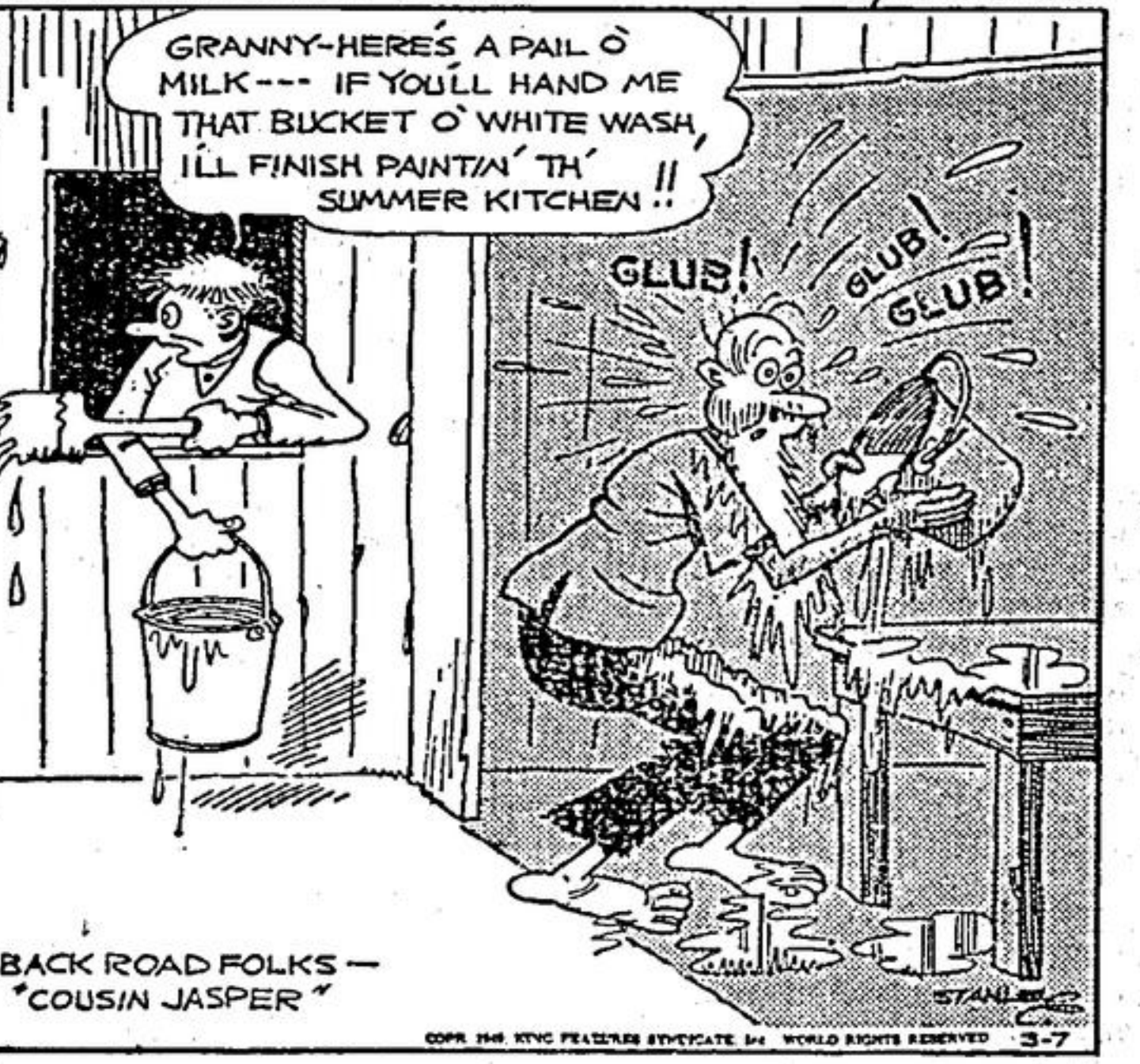

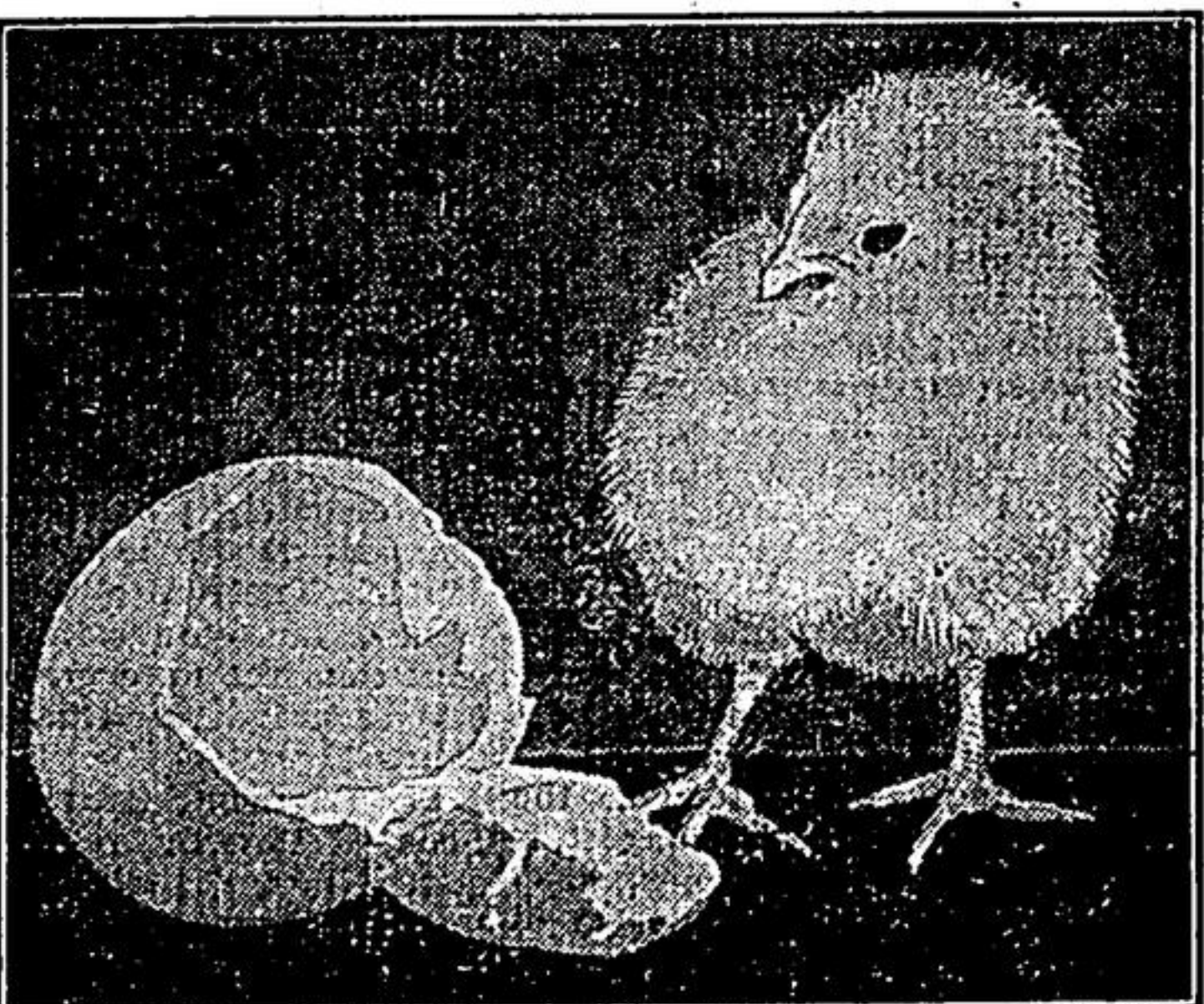
