Ask Hunters Take Out Township Licenses

The Ontario Department of Game and Fisheries will urge this session of the legislature to amend the Game and Fisheries Act making it incumbent upon hunters to provide themselves with a township-issued licence. East Whitby township is the most recent place to take up the demand, which has been passed by clubs in the townships of Markham, Whitchurch, Pickering, Vaughan and Whitby. Said one of the interested parties, "this is a vexing problem of uncontrolled hunting over township property." The resolution urged two things upon the government. The first was that nimrods be not allowed to hunt from sundown on Saturday to sunrise on the following Monday and the second was that such hunters be required to purchase a license from the township in which they do their hunting. It is a fact that all these townships are game preserve areas, yet through a defect in the Act all that is required to hunt across them is a provincial license. Councillor Norman Down at the recent Whitby meeting, said that soon hunters would be sitting on the farmers' back stoop shooting, or something to that effect.

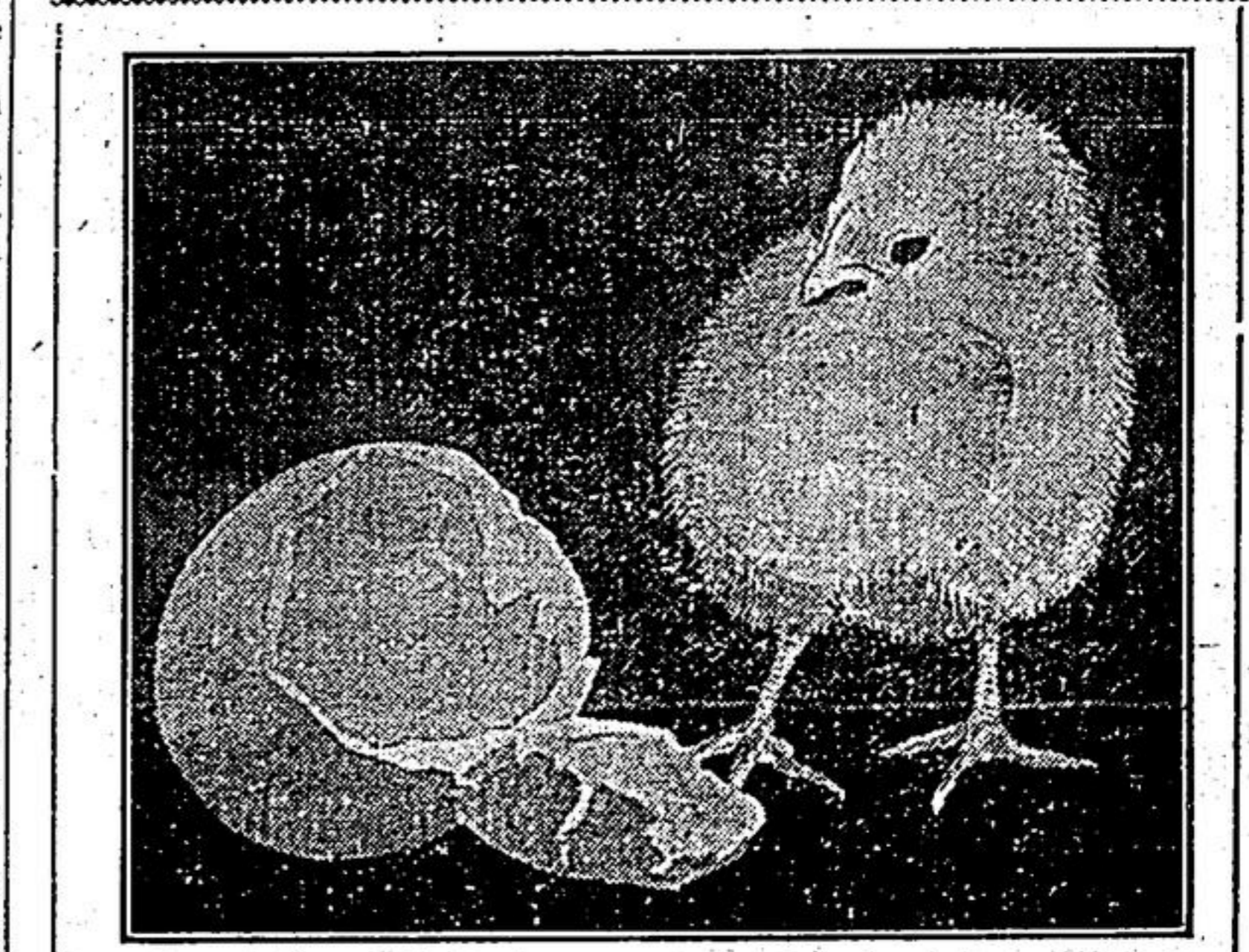
