200 ORIGINALS ATTEND REUNION OF 116th BATTALION

Oshawa, April 11-Nearly 200 members of the original 116th Battalion, Ontario County's contribution to the Canadian Expeditionary Force in the First World War, met here Saturday and Sunday for their annual reunion.


