**Supplies Reach Foodless Lake Simcoe Islanders**

Snake Island, Ont., April 11—The population of seven persons on this Lake Simcoe island ended a brief famine last night when they ate their first food since Wednesday. The three-day fast was brought on when ice between the island and Keswick broke up suddenly last week.

Caretaker Harold McGee had crossed for food a week ago, but brought back only enough food for a few days.

A small channel opened in the ice Saturday and McGee rowed across, only to be caught on the mainland when the channel closed. Yesterday he borrowed a steel-bottomed boat and smashed his way to the island with food for his wife and two sons and for 87-year-old Jim Ashquabe and his two sons.

The island is held by the Chippewa Indians and McGee is the Indian Affairs Department's caretaker there.

**Pale, Chastened Oleo Will Appear in May**

Ontario's new Margarine Control Act won't go into effect before the second week in May. Proclamation of the act has been delayed to give manufacturers time to change over their plants to meet the new regulations governing the manufacture and sale of butter substitute.

Premier Thomas L. Kennedy had tentatively set the date of proclamation for May first, but decided to withhold proclamation after a meeting with margarine manufacturers yesterday.

Coloring of margarine came up for discussion at the Government-Manufacturers Conference and it's been decided that manufacturers can provide additional coloring material to consumers. But the coloring must be packed separately and cannot be included in the same

The coloring clause in the act brought the only major contention from opposition members, when the 1949 act respecting oleomargarine was passed in the Ontario Legislature.
