Death came with great suddenness to Mr. Thomas Robinson on Monday, May 9th. One of the oldest residents of this location, only last September he celebrated his 90th birthday. He had enjoyed good health up to a few months ago. A very industrious man all his life, he had been working around the flower beds on the morning of his death. The funeral was held on Wednesday, May 11th, with burial in Prospect cemetery.

The late Mr. Robinson was born at North Burton, Yorkshire, England, and came to Canada as a young man, settling first at Delhi, later moving to Toronto where he worked for a number of years. For the past 25 years Mr. and Mrs. Robinson have lived at the home of their daughter, Mr. and Mrs. J. Hollinger, just off the 8th concession, north of Markham.

'Operation Carp' Begins In Sturgeon Waters

The removal of Carp from Sturgeon Lake at the mouth of Emily Creek is now in full swing. Up to May 13th, 1,345 Carp weighing almost 5½ tons have been removed. These are all large adult fish averaging over 8 lbs. each and their removal will leave a large gap in the Carp population. Only 22 Carp were taken during April but the big run started on May 1st when 526 Carp were removed from the pound net in one lift. This is disclosed in the weekly bulletin of the Lindsay Lands and Forests office.

The Carp is a member of the minnow family Cyprinidae but isn't native to America. It is one of the large freshwater fishes of Asia, being introduced first into Europe and then America. Carp are among our most prolific fishes producing over 2,000,000 eggs each in females weighing 15 to 20 pounds. They grow more rapidly than most native fish and the young may reach a length of 8 inches or even more in one year.

The bulletin explains: "The extent of the harm done by Carp to game fish populations is rather difficult to determine accurately. Carp are omnivorous feeders, eating some animal matter, much plant material and mud."

"They root up the bottoms, overturning and destroying the vegetation. If very plentiful, they may render the water turbid and the bottom unfit for the feeding and spawning of native game fishes. Some fish eggs are undoubtedly devoured by Carp while rooting in the bottom and many a favorite fishing hole has been ruined by Carp as they leave a mass of weeds floating on the surface. Carp are blamed for the destruction of the natural habitat of muskrats, ducks and game fish. All in all, the Carp, is an exceedingly unpopular fish in the inland waters of Ontario."
