### FISH PIE made with MAGIC

Prepare 1 c. medium-thick white sauce and mix in 1 1/2 c. flaked cooked fish, 1 tbs. finely-chopped onion, 1 1/2 tbs. finely-chopped parsley, 1 tbs. drained capers or chopped pickle, 2 tbs. lemon juice, salt to taste; turn into greased small casserole. Place in hot oven, 450°, while making topping. Mix and sift into bowl, 1 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 3/4 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 2 tps. Magic Baking Powder, few grains cayenne, 1/4 tsp. salt. Cut in finely 2 tbs. shortening; mix in 3/4 c. shredded cheese. Mix 1 beaten egg and 2 tbs. milk. Make a well in centre, pour in liquid and mix lightly with a fork. Knead dough lightly, pat out to fit casserole, place on top of hot filling and slash top for escape of steam. Bake in hot oven, 450°, 18-20 minutes. Yield—4 servings.

### OLD PIANO FIRM CLOSES LAST STORE

One of Toronto's oldest firms, Mason & Risch, piano manufacturers, will leave the retail field this week after 78 years' activity. Its last store, in Vancouver, will be closed, and the company will concentrate on its old-established manufacture of pianos for a market it reports again is growing in Canada.

A. J. Mason, 80-year-old president and a direct descendant of one of the company founders, has announced that the company in addition to increasing piano production, is preparing to branch out into a new field—the manufacture under a trade name what it calls a "smaller than miniature" size piano for the modest income brackets.

Mason & Risch started in 1871 as a small music store when Toronto had a population of fewer than 75,000 people, and Canada had only recently become a dominion. The founders, T. G. Mason and Vincent M. Risch, opened their first store at 32 King Street west. In 1877 the

two men, with the same confidence in the future of Canada that the Fathers of Confederation had shown, opened a piano factory at King and Bathurst Streets and produced their first piano. It was sold to a Professor William Philp of Guelph, well-known bandmaster and organist of that time. The piano caused much comment in the Southern Ontario city.

### Many Experiments

Before they produced that first piano, the two pioneer manufacturers made many experiments to find the correct combination for the sounding boards and hammers, and other wood parts to meet the standards they had set themselves.

### MEMORIES OF VERANDAS

During the past few years many homes have been built in Niagara Falls and district, but we cannot remember, offhand, one of them with a veranda. Nowadays, instead of a veranda there is usually a small concrete platform, just big enough to stand on while the front door is being opened. Perhaps there was ample reason for discarding the veranda with its columns and its turned balustrade. For one thing it will cut the cost of keeping the house in proper repair.

### Italy Takes 125 Holsteins from Canada

The Trade Department announces that 125 purebred Canadian Holstein-Friesian heifers have been ordered by Italian breeders and further orders are expected. The heifers will leave Montreal, May 21, on the S.S. Marchport.

The announcement said the order was placed by Italian breeders following smaller token shipments during the last six months. Last November, four Holstein-Friesian bulls valued at \$15,000 were flown to Italy via New York, marking the first shipment of Canadian purebred cattle to Italy. Last March, an additional 11 head were flown to Italy from
