Sections Would Oppose Public School Area

According to a questionnaire answered by the school section in the Township of Whitechurch, nine out of twelve sections are not favorable to the formation of public school area board for the whole township. Result of the poll was announced before Whitechurch council on Friday at Vandorf.

Council had instructed Clerk J. W. Crawford to issue a formal letter to the trustees setting out the advantages to the ratepayers if the township would amalgamate the sections and avoid building additions to some schools to care for overcrowding, while others are half empty.

Vandorf, White Rose and Hartman sections were the three who sent back word, declaring their approval of a township board, while all other sections were opposed. The trustees in most instances had called a ratepayers meeting to put the issue before, and at these meetings fear was expressed that a township board would take away local authority from the section.

A second question put by the township council through the clerk indicated in reply that most sections were in favor of the township paying the whole cost of auditing school books. The alternative to this is for each section to pay its

individual cost. No matter which system of payment is adopted the township ratepayers pay the bill. It would appear however that the expense coming through the school might earn some kind of grant, but the matter is so small as hardly worth consideration. The fact is, the property owners of Whitechurch pay for the audit under either plan.

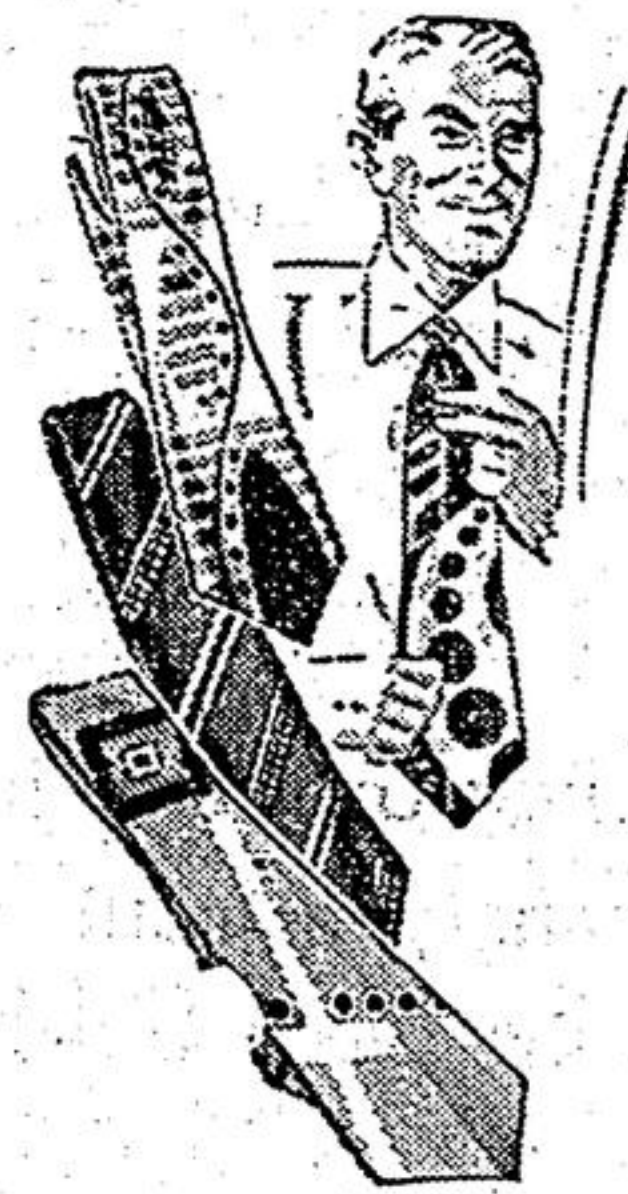
While on the school issue, the council decided to offer a scholarship in each of the three sections for students attending Newmarket, Aurora and Stouffville-Markham H. S. areas. This will be a cash award of \$25 in each section for general proficiency. Private citizens are invited to add to this prize by donating additional cash.

15,700 Trout Fingerlings Are Planted

Restocking of lakes in Haliburton County has been going forward at a good rate, according to the bulletin of the Lands and Forests Dept. Thus far, 15,700 speckled trout fingerlings have been planted in county waters, and distribution of maskinonge fry is now complete.

Lunge fry, planted a few weeks ago in the three large ponds at the Deer Lake Hatchery, are being reared to fingerling size, and their diet will consist of 675 million sucker eggs just received by Hatchery Manager Jackson. Distribution of Lunge fingerling will be started in two weeks or so, and will continue on into July, when the fingerlings should reach five or six inches in length.

A number from here attended the Oddfellow's service at Port Perry on Sunday.

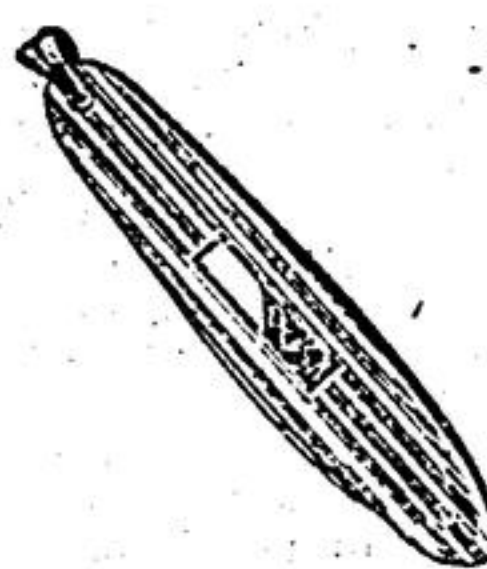

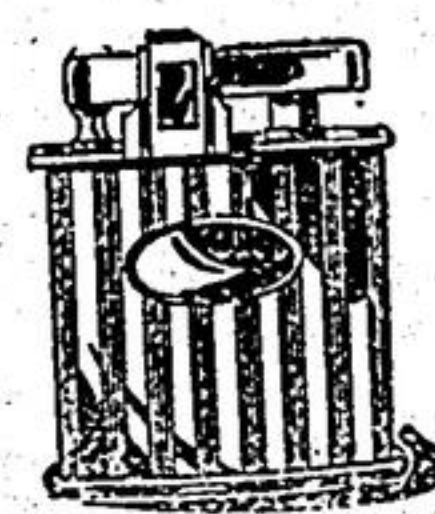
