## Ponder Enlarging Home for Aged Near Newmarket

Investigation into the possibility of enlarging the 77-year-old York County Home for the Aged, near Newmarket, was ordered on Thursday by County Council.

Speaking after the June report of the commissioners of the home had been presented, L. E. Ludlow, provincial inspector of homes for the aged, said the York home was too small to be adapted to the segregation system of caring for the aged. The home commissioners were instructed to bring in a report in the November session, including the cost of building a new wing.

Under recent provincial legislation the commissioners reported 50 per cent of operation and maintenance costs and 50 per cent of construction cost would be provided by the province.

Following a recommendation by the Ontario fire marshal's department, council approved expenditure of \$6,400 for special renovations to the Home for the Aged. The home was built in 1872 and 1927. It has accommodation for 92 people at present there are 13 vacancies.

Mr. Ludlow said in 1881 people over 65 in York County numbered 3.9 per cent of the population. In 1941, he said, the proportion was 8 per cent, and it was expected that by 1971 it would be 12 per cent.
