## Waiter Will Live to Wed Following Lake Simcoe Accident

Given less than an even chance for recovery when brought to Toronto General Hospital with wounds in his abdomen following a shooting accident near Sutton, Norman Adamson, 23-year-old Toronto hotel waiter, may be able to keep a wedding date with his lovely dress model fiancée in August after all.

Since the accident when he was rushed from Sutton in grave condition, Adamson has rallied from three blood transfusions. His spirits were heightened by daily visits from his bride-to-be, Audrey Stuart of Montreal, who has maintained a constant vigil over his hospital bed.

Adamson and his fiancée were on a fishing trip with Adamson's brother, Ken, and his wife Monday afternoon when a .22 calibre rifle they took along for target practise accidentally discharged. The rifle was propped against a seat in the boat with the barrel pointed at the youth's stomach. It discharged while the fishing party was several hundred yards from shore. The blast of the rifle caused

Adamson to reel backward into the water. His fiancée reached out and held him until the others pulled him back. Both Adamson and Miss Stuart were in bathing suits when they arrived at the hospital.

Taken to the office of Dr. Michael Tuckie, the wounded man was rushed to Toronto. Doctors there found the bullet had entered his stomach, shattered his kidney and struck the spine.

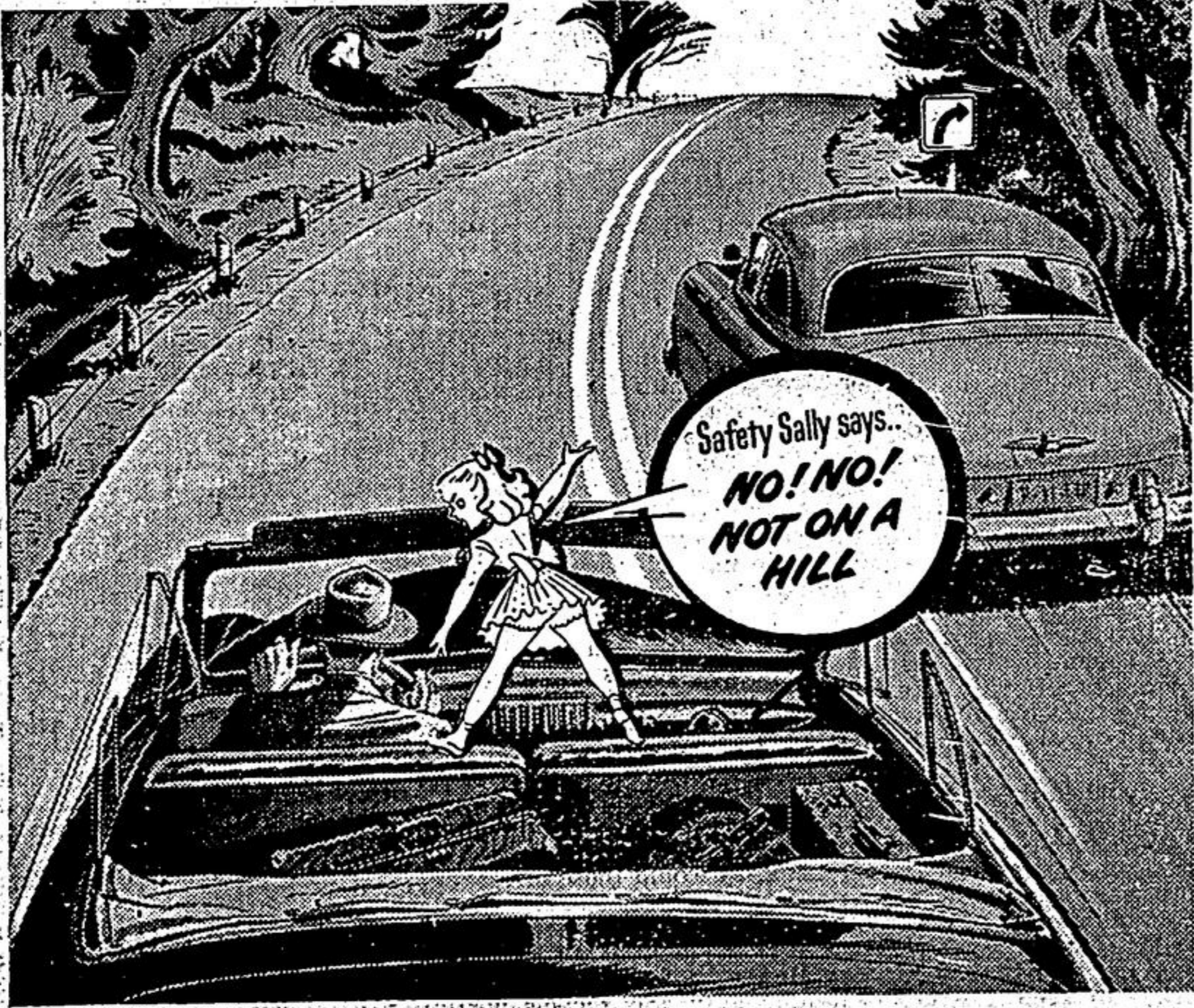
