Residents of Lakeview district in Ontario, have sought aid of department of agriculture in destroying large beetles known as "pelednota punctata" a rare variety, which have been feeding on leaves of fruits and vegetables throughout the district. The beetle is somewhat unusual in that the adult feeds on the leaves of grapevines while the larvae feed on the decaying roots of trees such as apple, pear and hickory.

**Addison Farm Fire  
Brings \$60,000 Loss**

Sightseers who jammed highways and driveways in the vicinity of the Harry Addison farm near Agincourt, on Thursday night, hampered firemen in reaching two blazing barns that caused an estimated \$60,000 damage. Mr. Addison is president and manager of Addison Industries, Ltd., Toronto.

Gerald Hughes, 20, son of the farm manager, narrowly missed death when a wall of one of the barns collapsed. He was driving a tractor and pulling machinery away from the rear of the burning building. The fire attracted city motorists, in the country to escape the heat, and the highway was blocked when firemen arrived a few minutes after being called. Precious minutes were lost as firefighters attempted to untangle the traffic jam so they could get their trucks near the blaze.

Agincourt, Scarborough Township, and North York Township firemen had the same trouble as they arrived at the fire one after the other.

Firemen fought to keep the blaze from spreading to the heating plant and dairy building of the farm only 100 feet away. There was more than 1,000 gallons of oil in the boiler room and although firemen kept a constant stream of water on the building it was scorched badly by the flames from the barn.

A bull and a puppy were taken to safety from the barn by Gerald Hughes and his sister, Dorothy, 18.

The entire 1949 crop of hay, more than 60 tons, was destroyed as were 60 chickens kept in the barn, a feed grinder and milking machine motor.

Firemen pumped the well dry and had to rely on water trucked from Agincourt to keep the house from catching fire.

The fire, believed started by a short circuit, kept North York firemen on the scene all night to make sure the blaze did not break out again.

**STRAWBERRY TRAFFIC

Gordon, superintendent of the Atlantic division, Canadian National Express. The Maritime strawberry season came to a close recently.

than carload consignments to various points in the Maritimes and to the United States.

**1949 MAPLE PRODUCTS**

Though the production of maple syrup and sugar is only a seasonal crop and is far from being the main source of revenue to farmers in suitable localities, the crop this year is estimated by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, to have a gross farm value of \$9,126,000. Expressed in terms of syrup the 1949 crop amounted to 2,485,000 gallons, an increase of 4 per cent over the previous year, but still below the ten-year 1938-47 average of 2,750,000.

Quebec is the leading province in the production of both maple syrup and sugar and in 1949 produced 1,894,000 gallons of syrup and 1,651,000 pounds of sugar. Ontario produced 399,000 gallons of syrup and 42,000 pounds of sugar. Production in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick combined was 13,000 gallons of syrup and 94,000 pounds of sugar.

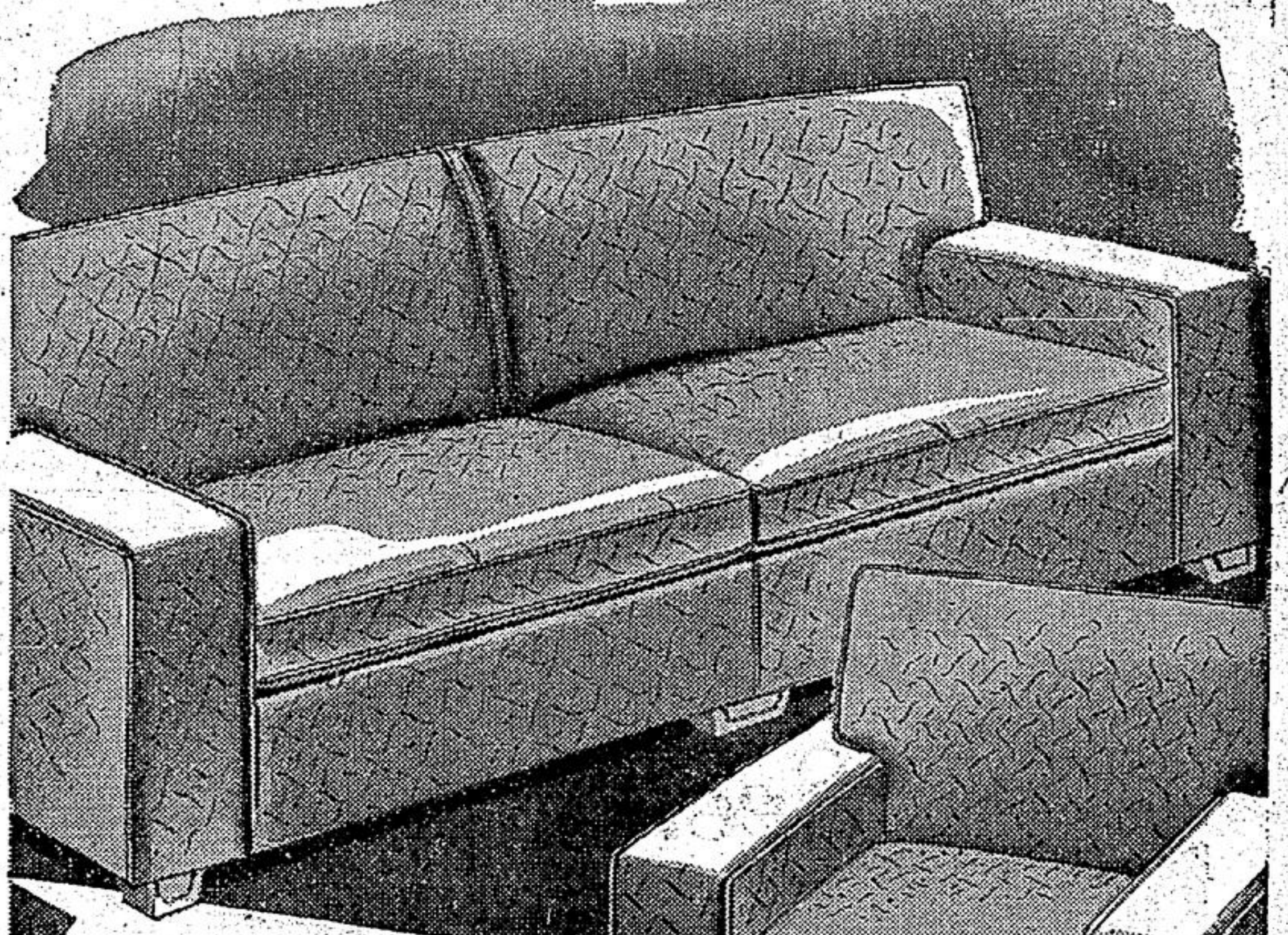
