Addison Farm Fire Brings \$60,000 Loss

Sightseers who jammed highways and driveways in the vicinity of the Harry Addison farm near Agincourt, on Thursday night, hampered firemen in reaching two blazing barns that caused an estimated \$60,000 damage. Mr. Addison is president and manager of Addison Industries, Ltd., Toronto.

Gerald Hughes, 20, son of the farm manager, narrowly missed death when a wall of one of the barns collapsed. He was driving a tractor and pulling machinery away from the rear of the burning building.

The fire attracted city motorists, in the country to escape the heat, and the highway was blocked when firemen arrived a few minutes after being called. Precious minutes were lost as firefighters attempted to untangle the traffic jam so they could get their trucks near the blaze.
