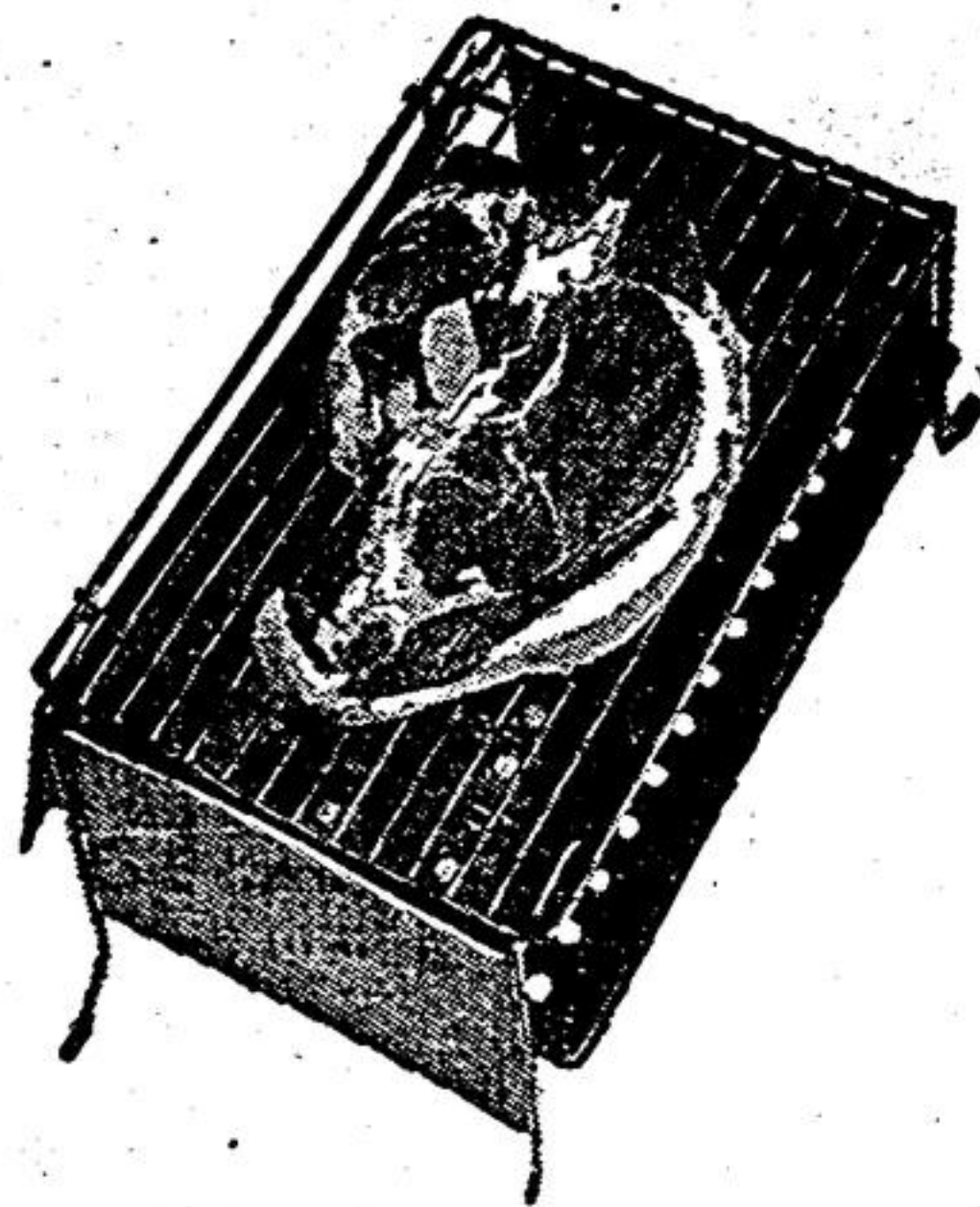

Once Rich, 6 in Family Get Breslau Home

An Estonian, who controlled 8,000 acres in Europe and had 600 men on his payroll, is starting life over again on a 56-acre farm with a badly out-of-repair house near Kitchener.

He is Johann Kalm, who arrived about three months ago from Sweden with his wife, two sons and two daughters. The children range in age from 16 to 25 years.

Fled to Finland
Manager of a seed improvement business in Estonia, Mr. Kalm fled to Finland in 1943 to escape death by the Russians. He was a land owner of the wealthy type for whom the Reds would have shown no mercy.

After a short haven in Finland, the entire family, although not travelling in one party, reached Sweden. They were in Sweden three years before friends in Canada arranged passage for them here.

Working closely with government departments, the Kalm seed business in Estonia had branches in every community. They exported many types of seeds besides supplying the home market.

Owned Two Homes
The new situation in which the family finds itself is a far cry from the old days when they had two fine homes, one in the city, and one at their large farm.

However, they are starting off in a practical way and putting first things first. Realizing that their livelihood must come from the farm, they have invested what money they had in good livestock and farm essentials. They have one producing Jersey and seven other young cows.

Other possessions include a bull calf, several pigs, 70 chickens and a team of horses.

Three members of the family will work in Kitchener as well as help on the farm.

One of their first "musts" will be renovation of the old house which, in its present condition, is hardly fit to live in. The Kalm's piano and other good furniture brought from Sweden stands in crates in the driving shed and will not be moved until the house is fixed up.

Fear Communist Control
The family, which appears natural, has a fanatical hatred of communism.

They might have remained in Sweden had it not been fear that Communists may some day gain control.

Mr. Kalm says the Swedes are playing with dynamite by not outlawing the Communist Party. And in his mind he contends the Canadian government is also making a mistake by tolerating communism.

2,000-Year-Old Bible Texts To Be Published in Autumn

Some of the oldest known Biblical texts soon will be available for study by scholars throughout the world.

Found accidentally by Arab goat-herders in a cave near the Dead Sea, the documents were brought to the United States and photographed by scholars here. Plans for publishing the photographic record and a transcription were announced by the American Schools of Oriental Research at Yale University.

The most ancient complete Biblical manuscript ever found—a copy of the Book of Isaiah—will be included in a volume now in preparation. It will be published in the fall.

The documents, dating back 2,000 years; are among those which were found in a cave in Palestine territory, now occupied by the Arab Legion. Two Arab goat-herders made the original discovery about two years ago, while fight was raging in Palestine. Eight scrolls of animal skin on which Hebrew characters were written were discovered in a hillside cave above the Dead Sea.

Four were brought to the United States, while the other four are in possession of the Hebrew University on Mount Scopus in Jerusalem.

Months after the original find, the cave was rediscovered by a detachment of the Arab Legion. A group of English archaeologists recovered fragments of other scrolls which now are in the British Museum in London.

In any event Walkerton holds the record for published facts and says about the matter:

"Mr. Jeurgens observed his eighty-second birthday by returning to his old love, the farm, and doing a full day's work assisting in threshing operations at the home of Mr. Stephen Little. This octogenarian who has seen many summers—come and go and has assisted at threshings every year since reaching his 'teens, can still hold his own with men whose lifetime has not yet reached the half-way mark of his eighty-two summers. Last year Mr. Jeurgens pitched eleven loads of oats on his 81st natal day during harvesting on Mr. Little's farm. Clean living and hard work, he claims, are the secret of his good health and longevity."

SUSPEND 21% MORE DRIVERS

Suspensions of driving licenses in Ontario in the first six months of 1949, at 5,695, are up 1,003 or 21.5 per cent over the 1948 period, according to a report from Highways Minister George Doucett. Convictions for (a) drunk driving jumped from 494 to 546; (b) operating with defective brakes, from 63 to 126; (c) improper passing,

turning, signalling, etc., from 380 to 592; (d) careless driving, from 1,934 to 2,088; (e) criminal negligence, from 0 to 4; (f) motor manslaughter, from 2 to 7.

HARVESTERS TO RECEIVE LOWER PAY

The annual interprovincial movement of Canadian harvesters is already well under way, but preliminary crop estimates, indicate pickings will be somewhat slimmer this year.

Most of Canada's agricultural districts are well-manned for the 1949 harvest, a Canadian Press survey shows, and the demand for import labor is light. There is no call for women and children.

Wages for farm hands are a bit lower everywhere this year, too. In Western Canada, wages are \$5 and \$6 a day for laborers and harvesters and in the eastern provinces the pay scale ranges between \$50 and \$100 a month.

Ontario is about through harvesting, and needed only 1,000 western helpers.

Clever Forgeries Net pair \$1,000 In Twin Cities

Further reports from defrauded merchants raise the loss in a recent cheque-cashing expedition by a pair of professional crooks to nearly \$1,000 for Waterloo and Kitchener merchants and banks.

Kitchener police said that so far 11 spurious cheques have turned up, all cashed in Kitchener or Waterloo last Saturday and ranging in value from \$65 to \$87.

Sought by police are a man and woman, both about 30 or 35 years of age.

Carefully Rehearsed
Det. Sgt. Harold Winfield, who is in charge of the investigation, said that the method of passing the cheques was carefully rehearsed. The couple would enter a store, ask for an article and discuss it in

man-and-wife terms.

They would then decide they could buy it if the clerk would cash a pay cheque. The cheque, purporting to be issued by a construction company working on the Seagram addition in Waterloo, was invariably signed by "F. Therrien," superintendent of the job.

Forgery of the signature is so expert that two cheques were passed on a Waterloo bank where the actual Mr. Therrien has an account. In one case the clerk compared signatures and decided that the forgery was genuine.

Pair Are Described
The man is described as about 5 feet, 10 inches tall, with a very tanned complexion and brown hair bleached lighter by the sun, a high forehead. When the cheques were passed he was wearing a brown slack suit and a tan shirt.

His companion is about five feet six inches tall. She has dark hair, a sallow complexion and has stooped shoulders.

They may even be man and wife. Several of the defrauded firms report that invariably the woman took the bills from the cashing of the cheque and gave the man only the extra silver.

The couple were passing under the names of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Miller, William Johnson and Edward Taylor.

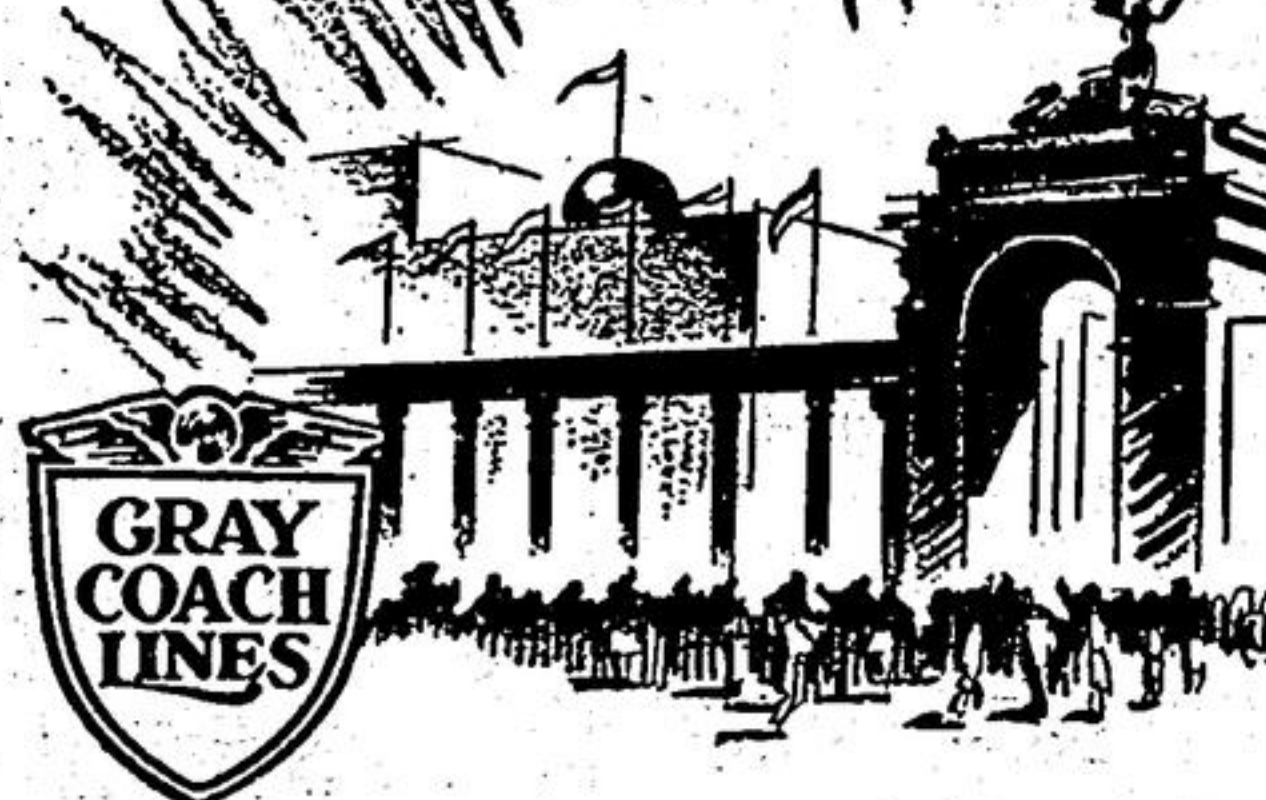
