AIR PROTESTS ON

Brougham, Aug. 25-Residents of Pickering Township will have a chance to voice objections to a recently-passed bylaw prohibiting building of one-story dwelling of less than 700 square feet floor space, when the municipal board meet here Sept. 9.

Township Clerk Lloyd T. Johnston announced the hearing will be held in the municipal building. The bylaw was passed June 7, listing almost a dozen restrictions to regulate building of homes, summer cottages, tourist cabins

In future, all houses and summer cottages of more than one story are required to have a ground floor area of 600 square feet or more.

Under the by-law, summer cottages or cabins may not be converted or used for living accommodation unless they conform to specified requirements. Trailer camps and overnight cabins are not permitted.
