We hear that a large barn on the McArthur farm east of Uxbridge was burned down Tuesday night when struck by lightning.

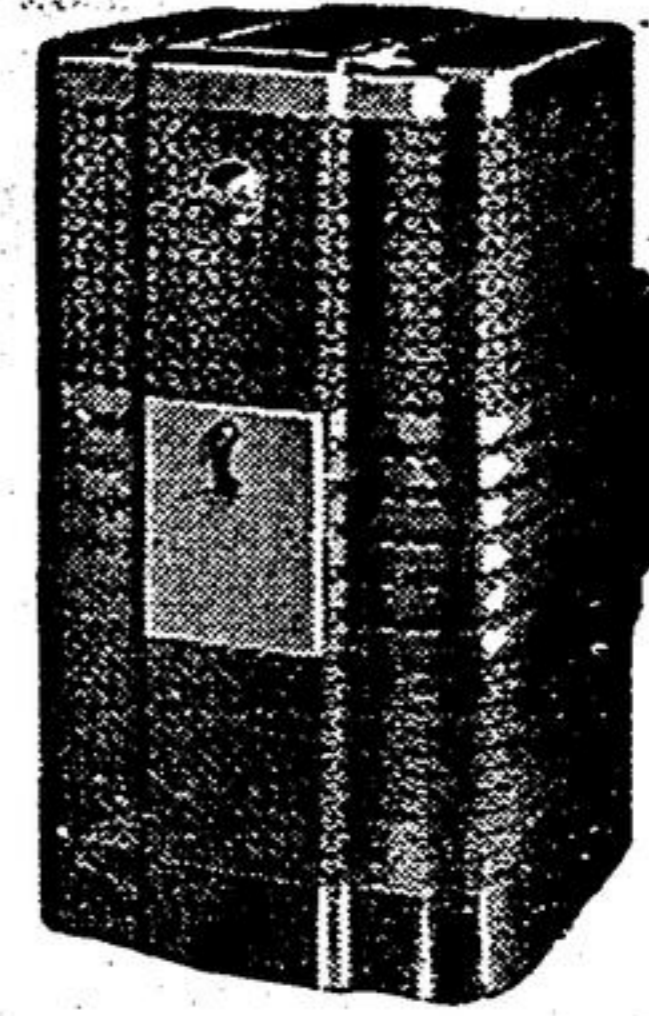

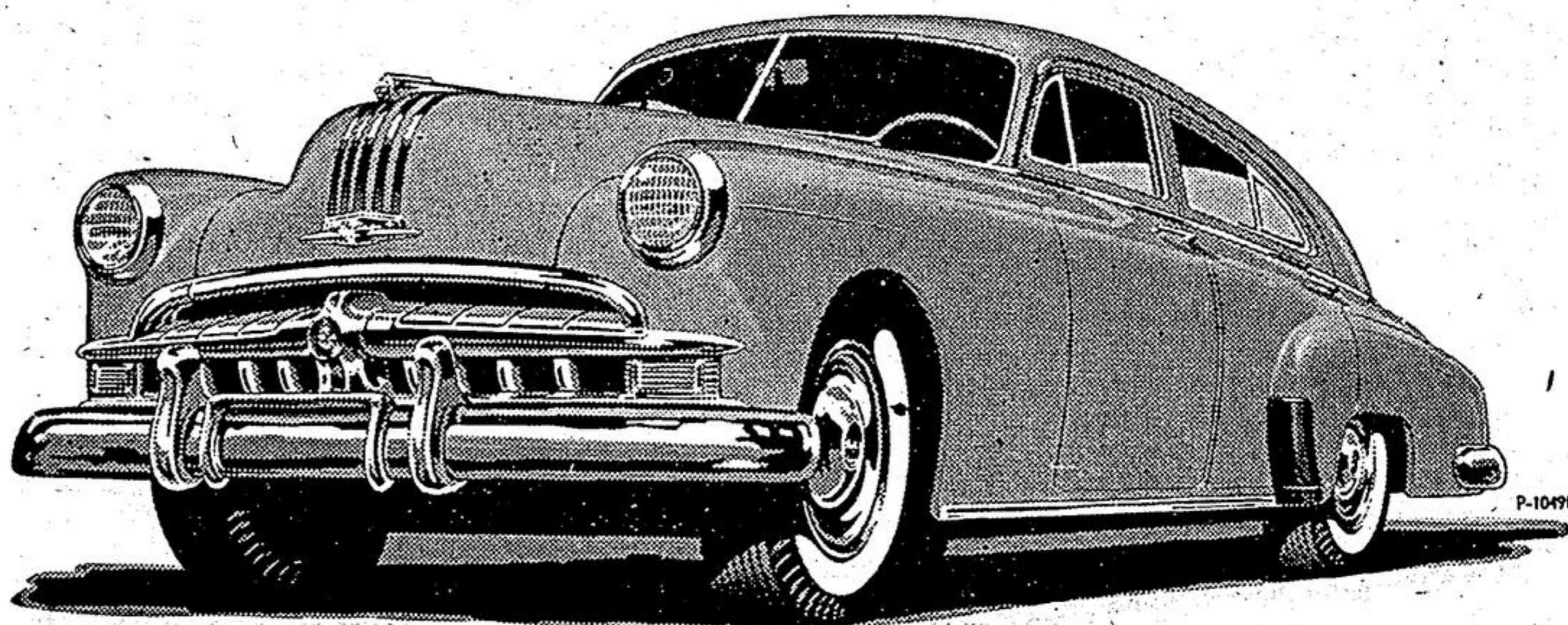
