CATTLE SHIPPERS SEEN BENEFITTING FROM NEW RATE

Ontario farmers shipping cattle to the United States stand to benefit as a result of dollar devaluation, providing present prices are maintained, W. P. Watson, Ontario livestock commissioner, said last night.

More than 100,000 head of dairy cattle went to the United States last year and the flow of beef cattle has been heavy since the embargo was lifted last August.

Exports should be stimulated because the farmers will be paid in U.S. currency which will bring a premium in this country, Mr. Watson added.

Dollar devaluation was greeted with a "wait and see" attitude by officials of the farm implement industry.
