#### Control of Ajax Big Question For Pickering

Do residents of Pickering Town ship want the municipal control of Ajax (pop. 2,600 potential assessment \$3,500,000) returned to them? This question was discussed by about 40 leading citizens of the township in Brougham Wednesday night. These people were present on invitation of the township council. George Finley, administrator, and W. L. A. Pope, regional supervisor of C.M. were also present. The same offer now being made to Pickering Township as is proposed for the Improvement District.
