AUTOMATIC COOKING

OTTAWA . LETTER

(By Jack Smith. M.P.)

The government hopes to conclude the business of this session some time next week and working with that objective morning, afternoon and night sessions are held daily including Saturday. The second session is likely to be called about February 1st.

The Minister of Reconstruction has a Bill before the House to encourage and assist in the construction of the trans-Canada highway. This project is one for which there has long been a popular demand and the government's action now is receiving support from all sides of the House. Highways of course are a provincial responsibility, but there has been a growing feeling in Canada that we should have one coast-to-coast highway.

Most provincial governments would have great difficulty in assuming alone the financial burden of completing a trans Canada route to adequate standards in addition to the demand for annual outlays covering capital expenditures and maintenance costs on their over-all highway systems.


