
#### NEW UXBRIDGE PUBLIC UTILITY

## A Man Can Live If He Tries To

Los Angeles-Albert Enoch, 57year-old chemist, has been living for some years now in an economic twilight which he calls "the far side of the sun."

He gets along-adequately and without complaint-on a total of \$6 a week. He earns the \$6 himself. Until a few weeks ago Enoch had resigned himself to obscure LATE FRED SCHELKE poverty. He set but one condition for the remaining years of his life for the remaining years of his life --financial independence.

How he attained that goal-on six self-earned dollars a weekwas one of those human-interest stories that go unnoticed in a busy metropolis.

Then his modest design for existence suddenly became a cause celebre-an issue in California's current pension controversy.

"The pensioners in the hotel where I live jumped all over me the day the newspaper carried a story about my \$6 a week budget,' Enoch says. "I used to have a lot of friends at the hotel. Now

"They say my \$6 a week, for which I am indebted to no one, makes their \$75-a-month state-paid pensions look a little like a fraud. Well, what's done is done. I meant no harm .."

His carefully-planned budget for staple foods comes to only \$1.50 a week. It consists of small eggs, bacon ends, evaporated milk, ground meat, fish, honey, peanut butter and coffee. He also buys a Light Wagon sack of tobacco and has about 20 cents left over from the \$1.50.

His only other expense is \$3.75 a week for a hotel room.

"When my leg doesn't bother Democrat me," says Enoch, "I walk to the wholesale market and get my vegetables free. After 10 o'clock in the morning you can salvage considerable fruit and vegetables from the big containers where they put produce that is unsaleable, but still

"Today I got onions, potatoes, celery, carrots, lettuce, peppers, corn and grapes.

"From the Salvation Army anyone may get bread and cakes for 2 Wash Stands the asking. I work for my clothes at a church. You can get a good free haircut in the basement of the Union Rescue Mission, although I usually try to give the barber a quarter. They also have facilities there to press your clothes and take a bath.

Despite a price reduction of eight to 10 cents a pound, Canadians this year have eaten 35,000,in good location. Don't miss this 000 pounds less butter than in 1948. Consumption is down three

J. H. Duplan, president of the National Dairy Council of Canada, cited these figures to illustrate the effect of uncertain export markets and the inroads of margarine competition.

The serious surplus problem would be discussed Dec. 12 and 13 in Ottawa, he said, at a meeting of more than 20 National Dairy Council directors.

Due to the drop in butter consumption, he told the Ontario Creamery Association, Canadians this year would consume less milk products per person than at any other time in the last 15 years.

"The consumption of margarine in those provinces where it is sold has in the space of only one year exceeded the per capita consumption in the United States, where it has been sold for more than 75 years," he said.

As a direct result of margarine competition, the purchasing power of 400,000 dairy farmers had been reduced this year by at least \$50,-000,000. "And this reduction," he said, "will be directly reflected in the income of all other industries and businesses."

The price spread on creamery butter between producer and consumer was one of the smallest of any food product. The farmer received 80 cents from every dollar the consumer paid for butter.

'Compare this to margarine made entirely from foreign oils," he said. "It has been estimated that only about 25 cents out of every consumer dollar goes back to the primary producer and that in a foreign country at the expense of our critical foreign exchange position."
