1/2 cup shortening ½ cup molasses 2 sq. unsweetened chocolate 21/2 cups flour two-thirds cup sugar . 1 tsp. baking powder 1/2 tsp. baking soda 1 tsp. ginger ¼ tsp. salt 4 cup milk

Combine shortening, molasses and melted chocolate. Sift together flour, baking powder, súgar, soda, ginger and salt; add to first mixture. Mix in the milk well. Chill until firm in electric refrigerator. Cut off in pieces about the size of your thumb; roll peanut shape, giving them a slight twist in the centre. Place on a glazed baking sheet. Bake in electric oven at 400 degrees for 6 minutes. Makes 24.


