1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
1 egg, beaten
1 tspn. vanilla
3 1/2 cups Five Roses Flour
3 tspn. baking powder
1/2 tspn. salt
1 cup mincemeat

Cream shortening, add sugar and cream together until light and fluffy. Add vanilla and beaten egg, beat well. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together and add alternately with milk to the creamed mixture. Chill for 15 minutes. Roll 1/2 inch thick and cut with a round cutter. On half of the cookies place 1 tspn. of mincemeat in the center and cover with the remaining cookies. Press the edges together. Bake in a moderate oven 375° F. for 15 minutes.

TURTI-FRUITI FUDGE
2 squares Baker's Unsweetened Chocolate
1/2 cup milk
2 cups sugar
Dash of salt
2 tablespoons butter
1 teaspoon vanilla

4 tablespoons (each) finely cut candied cherries, candied pineapple, figs and nuts
4 tablespoons raisins (rinsed, thoroughly dried and finely cut)

Add chocolate to milk; place over low flame. Cook until mixture is smooth and blended, stirring constantly. Add sugar and salt; stir until sugar is dissolved and mixture boils. Continue boiling, without stirring, until a small amount of mixture forms a very soft ball in cold water (232° F.). Remove from heat. Add butter and vanilla. Cool to lukewarm (110° F.); then beat until mixture begins to thicken and loses its gloss. Add fruit and nuts. Turn at once into greased pan, 8 x 4 inches. Decorate with additional fruit. When cold cut in squares. Makes 18 large pieces.

Talks with His Parents in England

Basil Thompson of Oshawa had one of the best Christmas presents anyone could give him, when he talked for over an hour at noon last Wednesday with his parents in England.

Basil, who is 25 years of age and employed in the advertising department of The Times-Gazette, has not spoken to his parents since he left his home in Weymouth, England, 15 months ago.

The conversation was made possible when a member of North Shore Radio Club, who owns a ham radio outfit, was listening in last Sunday with his set. He picked up another ham operator in Bridport, England, G40V, and with Basil in mind, asked the English operator if he knew where Weymouth was situated. It turned out it was only 18 miles away. Arrangements were then made between the two hams to contact Basil's parents in Weymouth and try to reunite the family over the radio-telephone, which is part of each ham set. A date was set, and the excited Basil could hardly do his work waiting for Wednesday to roll around.

But right on time and clear as a bell, Basil heard his parents' voices as well as that of his 13-year-old brother, Brian.

Everyone was so excited that the conversation was mixed with questions and eager voices. "Merry Christmas," was echoed and re-echoed over the radio-telephone from son to parents and vice-versa.

"It was just grand," said Basil, in his quaint English accent, when it was all over. "What a Christmas present."

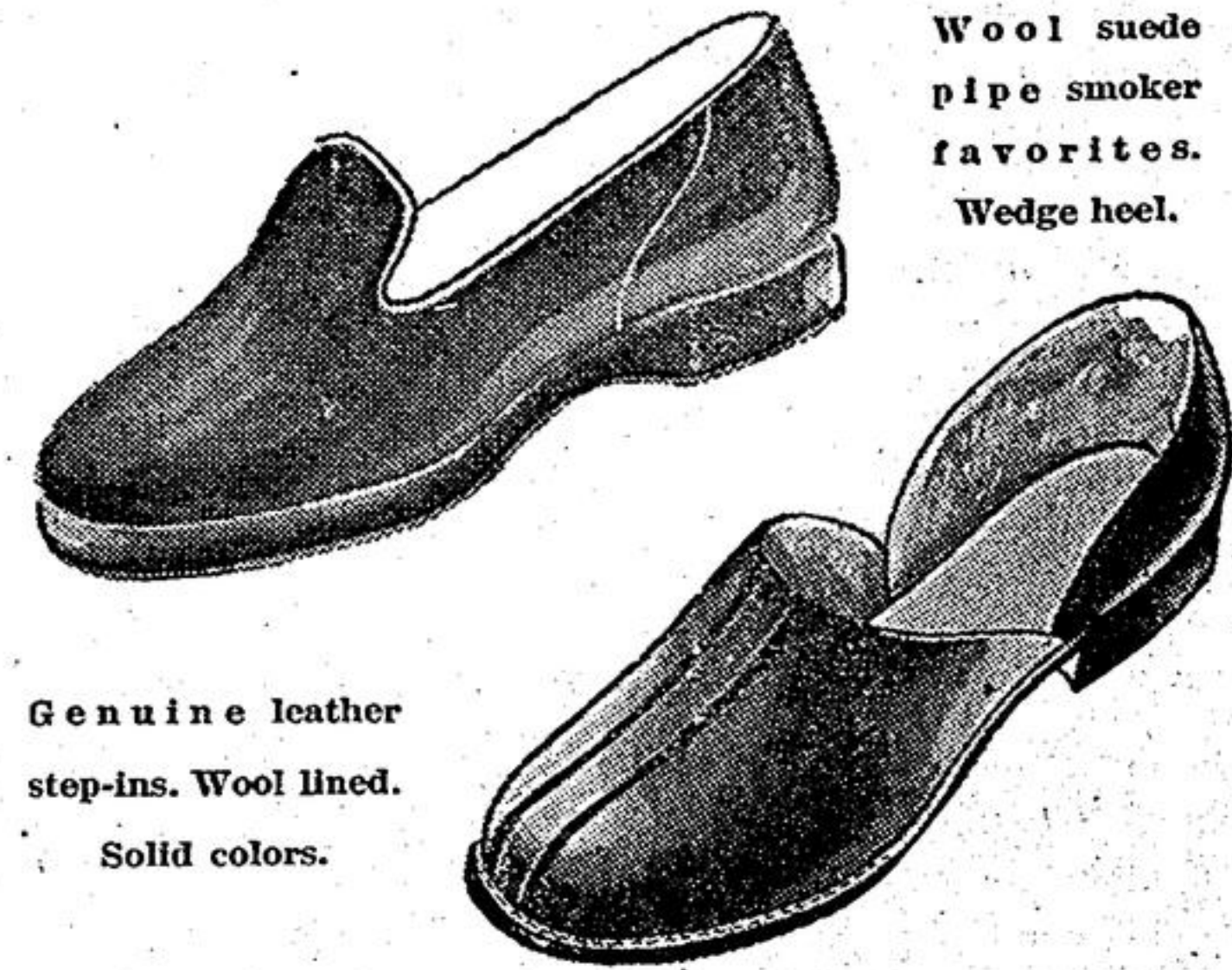
