They remember when the great stationary sawmill was in operation, in winter great logs of choice pine and hemlock were drawn from the adjacent forests with sleighs and horses, the drivers so proudly exhibiting the superiority of their teams and brass mounted harness.

The Fairs, Dobles, St. Johns, Shiers and all the pioneers of long ago greeted one another and after unloading the logs at the mill always saved time to visit Mrs. Ruddy in her large kitchen, where they were warmed with hot cups of tea and tastes of her culinary
