In the District Cup play, J. A. Walton's Agincourt rink triumphed over J. Coughnee, 16-6, and R. Shadlock's Agincourt foursome won over D. Hogins' Stouffville rink 17-9, for a total win of 33-15.

In the first round of the Tankard eliminations, Stouffville triumphed over Agincourt and Unionville eliminated Locust Hill. In the final game, W. Brillinger's Stouffville rink won 20-10 over L. McMullen's rink and the margin was enough to give Stouffville the victory, although J. Grant's Unionville rink won the other half of the event, 16-13, over M. Watt's Stouffville four.
