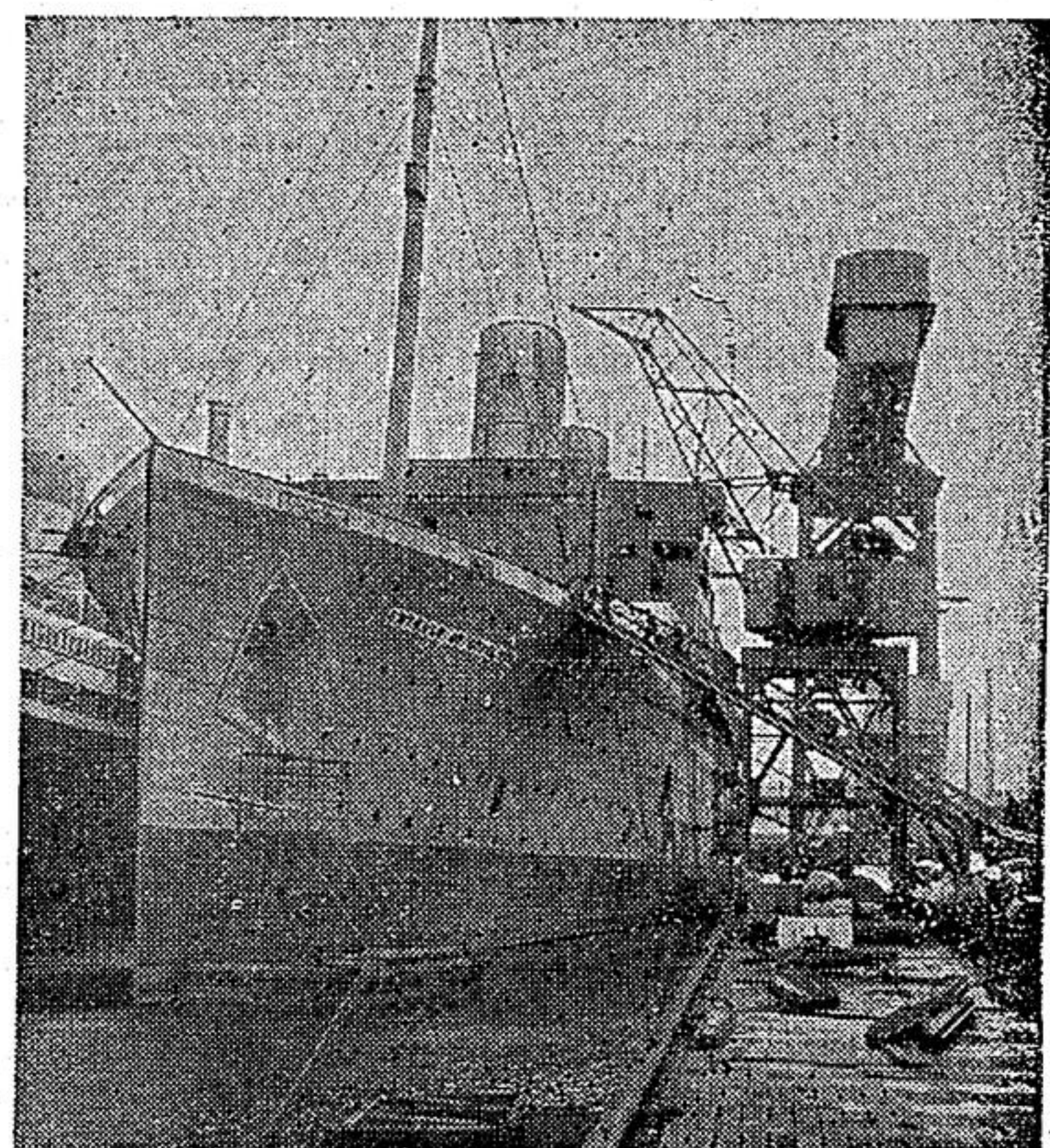

Next May 9 the 26,000-ton Empress of Scotland, which before the war operated as the Empress of Japan and was the largest and fastest passenger vessel on the Pacific Ocean, will sail from Liverpool for Greenock, Scotland and Quebec City on her first post-war peacetime service voyage. The above photo gives some idea of the magnitude of work being done at the Fairfield Shipbuilding Yard, Govan, Scotland, where a two-year reconditioning to Empress luxury standards after 3 1/2 years enviable war service is now being finished. The Empress of Scotland will carry 663 passengers.
