Darlington Township

Peter Proskin of Darlington township pleaded guilty before Magistrate Baxter for cutting maple, oak, elm, beech and pine trees having a diameter of less than ten inches, contrary to the provisions of Bylaw No. 1553 of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham. The charge was laid by Mr. Howard Millson, who was recently appointed Tree Commissioner for Durham County. The by-law was passed in 1947 in the interests of conservation to restrict unlimited cutting of young trees. Mr. A.W.S.
