ONTARIO HUNTERS LIMITED TO SIX COTTONTAILS A DAY

Six cottontail rabbits a day is the new limit for Ontario hunters, under an amendment to the Game and Fisheries Act, introduced in the legislature this session by Hon. Harold Scott, minister of lands. This limit is already effective in several Ontario counties. Further protection to this type of game stipulates the sale purchase or barter of cottontails is prohibited, and the use of ferrets in hunting them is banned.

Anyone hunting in townships which license hunters of pheasants, rabbits and foxes, must now have a license from local authorities as well as the sum license issued by the province.
