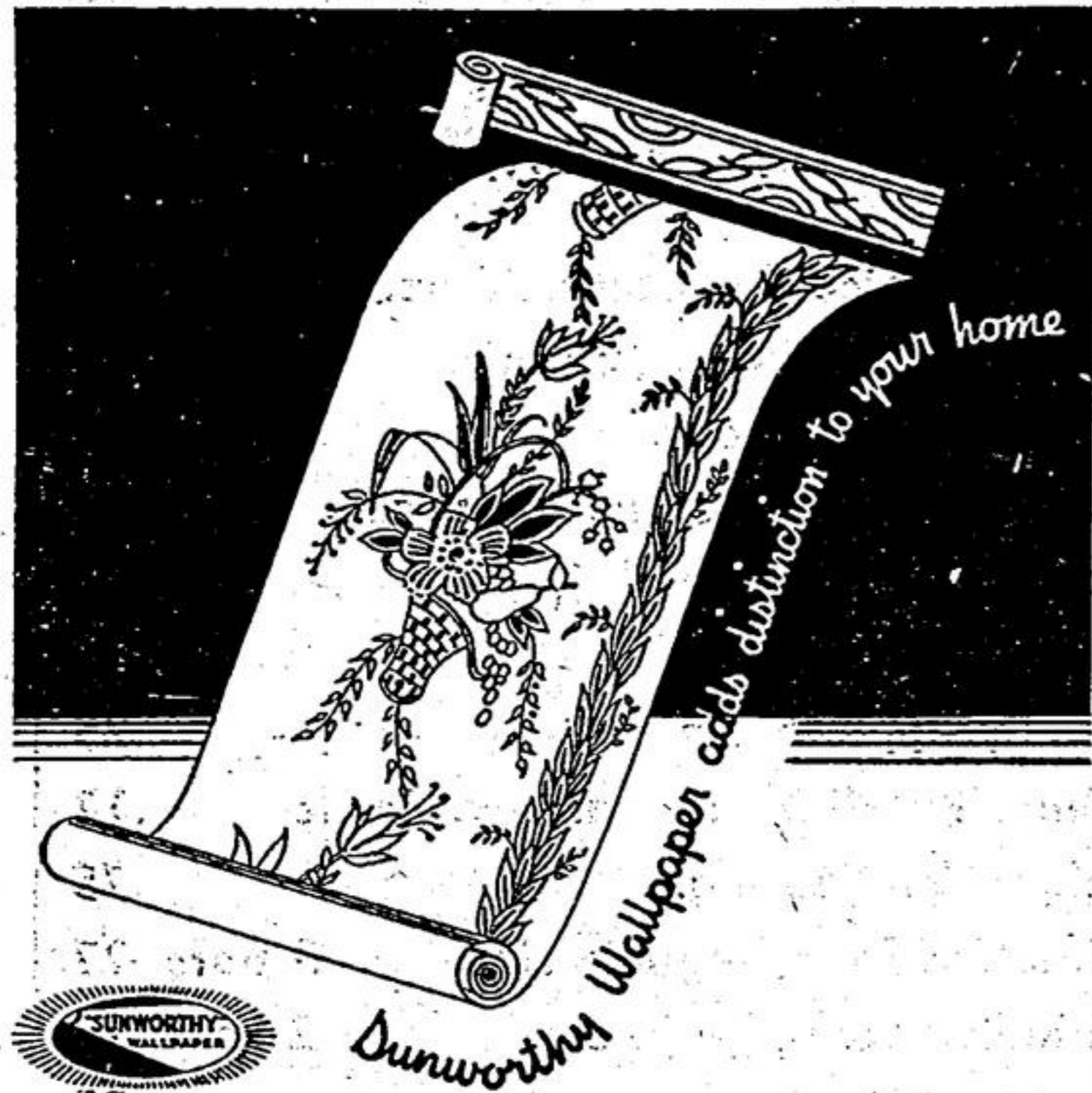

Pickering Pays Nearly One-Fifth County Taxes

The Ontario County tax rate for the current year will be seven mills or 1.2 mills higher than in 1948, county council decided last week. This levy will be upon a total county assessment of \$38,135,490. Total amount to be raised by taxation is \$273,948.43.

A breakdown of the tax levy shows that \$144,301.31 is apportioned to general fund, \$11,740.65 for the County Home, \$112,906.47 for county roads and \$4,500 for suburban roads. The foregoing figures do not, of course, represent total expenditures, for certain items are subsidized by the Ontario government, notably the road expenditures.

1948 surplus of \$7,982.76 has been taken into account. Moreover in this department a deficit budget has been calculated to the extent of \$4,720.93 since total estimated expenditures of \$157,505 are proposed for the coming year.

In terms of mill rate, 3.7 is for the general rate (a motion to make it 3.5 was defeated); three-tenths of a mill will provide for the county home and three mills is for roads.

Total general estimates expenditures for the current year are approximately \$20,000 more than last while estimated revenue is approximately \$9,000 above last year.

Clerk Treasurer William Manning said the levy would be divided among the minor municipalities according to the following table:
