FARM FORUM NEWS

No farm forums reported this week. Several of the forums in Markham township met in the Veterans Hall, Unionville, with the Federation of Agriculture where Mr. Ray Heigott addressed the meeting on Federation of Agriculture. His remarks were as follows.

Mr. Heigott thought it a sad story to hear of so many farmers who did not know that they had paid their Federation fees along with their township taxes.

The Township branch is the most important unit because it gives each and every person a chance to air their views.

We as members have some responsibilities—(1) Physical support—to read, help, and think through the Federation activities then attend our meetings and let our leaders know whether we are satisfied or dissatisfied—we have the best of leaders, but they are not mind readers.

(2) Financial support—Last summer for 2 months the Federation closed its doors on activity owing to the lack of funds.

(3) Educational support—Learn to pool resources, don't cover the same ground for every farm organization—cover it for Federation and then draw from there for our hog producers, Milk producers, etc.

The farm forum is a splendid strength to the Federation and the Federation should strive to strengthen the forums. A group of interested people meeting weekly could discuss any farm problem that confronts them and then send their decisions to the Federation.

Mr. Heigott said it showed a great co-operation spirit to see the forums and federation meeting jointly once a month on review nights.
