Commissioner W. H. Stringer said last week that J. Ernest Keays of Belleville was formally discharged from the Ontario Provincial Police force-and that Keays knows it.

Keays recently applied for the position of police chief for Pickering township.

Keays, a former constable; charged publicly in 1948 that there was maladministration of justice in the Belleville area. A Royal Commission last July found the charges groundless and recommended that he be fired.

He claimed last week in Kingston that he never was officially discharged and that he would continue to wear his policeman's uniform until he got one - "honorable or dishonorable."

Commissioner Stringer said: "Provincial Constable J. E.Keays of Belleville was dismissed from the Ontario Provincial Police force by order-in-council dated July 14, 1949, and Provincial Constable Keays was so advised by registered mail."






