## SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Lesson for June 18  
Golden Text.—Have we not all one  
father? hath not one God created  
us? why do we deal treacherously  
every man against his brother, by  
profaning the covenant of our  
fathers?—Mal. 2: 10

Approach to the Lesson  
Malachi, the last of the prophets  
until the coming of John the Bap-  
tist, was raised up of God to sound  
a clarion call to the returned rem-  
nant of Judah, following the  
rebuilding program of Zerubbabel  
—and Nehemiah, with a view to  
exercising the hearts and consci-  
ences of the people as to their  
actual spiritual condition. It was  
very evident that while there had  
been considerable concern for  
God's glory among the fathers who  
returned from Babylon and Persia  
to the land of Palestine there had  
been a steady decline of spiritual-  
ity and positive righteousness  
among their children in the years  
that followed. This is something  
that had been duplicated again and  
again in the history of the pro-  
fessed people of the Lord. It was  
true after the conquest of Canaan  
(Josh. 24: 31). It has been manifes-  
ted down through the centuries of  
church history. Every new revival  
movement has been characterized  
by a return to God and His Word,  
often at great cost. But invariably  
there has been a decline in the  
piety and unworldliness of those in  
succeeding generations who were,  
one might say, born into a place of  
privilege and had not known what  
it was to suffer and sacrifice for  
the truth's sake. So it had been  
with those who succeeded the  
heroic men and women who obeyed  
the call of God to return to the  
land and its desolate cities to  
rebuild the Temple and the walls  
of Jerusalem. Those who followed  
after them settled down into a  
careless formalism, from which  
they were summoned to reality by  
the solemn voice of the Prophet  
Malachi, and four hundred years  
later by John the Baptist.

The Historical Setting  
We know nothing whatever of  
the family from which Malachi  
came, or of his own personal  
experiences. His name means "My  
messenger," and we do not read of  
him anywhere, else in Scripture,  
nor do we have any particulars  
concerning him in this little book  
which closes the old Testament  
canon. His messages were given  
some time later than those of  
Haggai and Zechariah, the two  
prophets nearest to him in time.  
They indicated a very sad state of  
affairs among the children of those  
who were privileged to rebuild the  
Temple, city, and walls of  
Jerusalem.

Verse by Verse  
Malachi 2: 10.—"Have we not all  
one father?" This passage is not  
teaching what is commonly called  
the universal fatherhood of God.  
It was Abraham to whom the  
prophet referred as the father of  
Israel; in the next sentence he  
speaks of God as Creator. As  
creatures of God we are all respon-  
sible to obey His Word and to  
show proper consideration to  
others.  
Chap. 3: 7.—"Return unto me,  
and I will return unto you, saith  
the Lord." This is always the way  
to lasting blessing. God is quick to  
respond to the penitent soul. But

## Field Inspector for Seed Potatoes

Certified seed potato growers are  
cautioned that June 15 is the dead-  
line for the receipt of applications  
for field inspections and these  
forms should be in the hands of  
the local district inspector by that  
date, says J. W. Scannell, Assis-  
tant Chief, Seed Potato Certifica-  
tion, Division of Plant Protection,  
Department of Agriculture, Ott-  
awa.

Mr. Scannell said that the  
application forms will soon be  
mailed to all certified seed potato  
growers whose crops were inspec-  
ted in 1949, and to those who have  
made a special request for them.  
If these are not received by June  
10, he advised each grower con-  
cerned to write to the local dis-  
trict inspector for the necessary  
form.

We suggested that the best time  
to send in the application form is  
as soon as possible after planting,  
returning it as directed on the  
lower right hand corner of the  
form. Should flooding or low lying  
land delay planting in some dis-  
tricts, notification of this should  
be sent to the local seed potato  
certification office, so arrange-  
ments may be made for inspection  
at the proper time.

When new seed is purchased,  
said Mr. Scannell, be sure and  
attach one certification tag to the  
application form, saving the  
remainder to give to the inspector  
when he calls to make the first  
field inspection. These tags should  
be carefully put away where they  
can be quickly found when requir-  
ed, not only by the grower him-  
self, but by other members of the  
family should he not be at home

Israel saw no reason to return, so

Verse 8.—"Will a man rob God?  
Yet ye have robbed me..... in tithes  
and offerings." The tenth of a  
their income belonged to God. But  
this they had forgotten. By using  
His tithes for themselves, they  
were guilty of robbing Him. Is not  
this also true of many today?  
Surely if a Jew, under Law, was  
obligated to give the tenth to God,  
a Christian, under grace, cannot do  
less and be guiltless.

Verse 9.—"Ye are cursed with a  
curse: for ye have robbed me,  
even this whole nation." The Law  
pronounced a curse on all who  
violated its precepts. No such  
curse is invoking under grace; but  
shall we, as Christians, forget our  
responsibilities to give as God has  
prospered us because we are not  
under Law, but under grace?

Verse 10.—"Bring ye all the  
tithes into the storehouse..... and  
prove me now..... if I will not.....  
pour you out a blessing, that there  
shall not be room enough to  
receive it." It was a challenge to  
test the Word of the Lord. He  
stood ready to bless if they were  
ready to acknowledge His author-  
ity over their lives and their  
possessions.

Chap. 4: 5.—"Behold, I will send  
you Elijah the prophet before the  
coming of the great and dreadful  
day of the Lord." Jesus declared  
that Elijah had already come, and  
that he had been rejected (Matt.  
17: 12; Mark 9: 13). He meant that  
John the Baptist came with a  
similar ministry to that of Elijah,  
but he was not received as such  
(Matt. 11: 14). So Elijah's coming is  
still future.

Verse 6.—"Lest I come and smite  
the earth with a curse." The last  
word of the Old Testament is  
"curse." This was all that the Law  
could bring to guilty men. But God  
was calling on sinners to face  
their true condition and turn to  
Him, that He might give blessing  
instead of a curse.

The Heart of the Lesson  
Men are prone to think that God  
is pleased with empty religious  
forms and ceremonies, while the  
heart is far from Him. His con-  
trovery with Israel was on this  
very account. They pretended to  
great love and respect for His  
name and His holy Temple, but  
they were living in selfishness and  
indifference to His revealed will.  
Therefore He could not do for  
them that which His loving heart  
desired. Yet He called upon them  
to repent and to get right with  
Him, promising to undertake for  
them if they but sought His face  
in sincerity. Let us see that the  
lesson is not lost upon us, but that  
we ever sanctify the Lord God in  
our hearts and honor Him in our  
lives.
