Mother of Mrs. Albert Smith Passes at 83

Sarah Adeline Ferguson who has lived with her daughter, Mrs. Albert Smith, since she moved to town six years ago, died at their home on Main Street East early Tuesday morning. Mrs. Ferguson had lost her sight last fall, and had been in poor health for the last month, but had only been bedfast for the past week during which she was unconscious.

Born 83 years ago last November she was the daughter of Thomas and Sarah Foster of Limehouse, in Peel County. Sixty-two years ago she married Peter Ferguson, who predeceased her over 30 years ago. Since then Mrs. Ferguson lived with Mrs. Smith on the farm near Musselman's Lake, and in Stouffville. At one time Mrs. Ferguson lived in Parry Sound. She was a member of Cheltenham Presbyterian Church, and a faithful worker in its organizations.

Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Albert Smith of Stouffville, Mrs. Wilbert Smith of Stouffville, a son Leslie Ferguson of Toronto, and nine grandchildren and nine great grandchildren. Also surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Mary Sharpe and Mrs. Louisa Sharpe of Brampton District.

Funeral services will be held in O'Neill's Parlours on Friday, June 30th, at 1 p.m., conducted by Rev. Douglas Davis, proceeding to Cheltenham Cemetery for interment. Pallbearers will all be nephews of Mrs. Ferguson.
