Tries To Rescue Grandson, Drowns With Him at Udora

A special horror. A few years ago Mrs. Bridger had come close to drowning—she had to be revived by artificial respiration. The daughter tried to launch a boat to save her mother who was floundering only 25 feet away, but there were no oars in the boat.

By that time other villagers from Udora appeared on the scene and Ted Dyer, Toronto salesman, who was building a cottage down the river, plunged into the millpond and tried to find the two bodies.

Harold Peers, a miller in Udora, summoned to the scene, gave orders to helpers at the mill to pull the boards out of the dam which supplies power to the mill to get the water level down. Peers, too, then dived in to look for them. Harvey Westgarth, a farmer, was third man to plunge into the river to help. Relatives and friends and almost the entire village had gathered helplessly on the banks. It was two hours after the drowning took place that Ted Dyer and Peers recovered the body of Mrs. Bagshaw with the aid of a pike pole. The body of young Michael was found shortly afterwards.

The two bodies were found in almost the same spot in which they had originally disappeared. Dr. M. D. Tuchtie, coroner, pronounced both grandmother and grandson dead. The bodies were taken to Pinkham funeral chapel in Sunderland.

Remove Fifteen Tons of Carp

A total of almost 15 tons of carp, or 29,800 pounds to be exact, have been removed from Lake Scugog and Sturgeon Lake this year, by officials of the Ontario Department of Lands and Forests; it was revealed following the completion of netting operations. The fish were distributed to farmers in the areas near the lakes and "they should have some terrific crops this year," a Department officer said. A total of 6,328 carp were taken during the netting work in addition to many other coarse fish.

The Carp, a sacred fish in China, grows to a considerable size and some, taken from Stewart's Creek and the Nonquon River, at Lake Scugog weighed 20 pounds, Department officers said. Because the carp root out weed beds, compete with game fish and disturb the spawning beds of sport fish, anglers have long urged their removal from game fish waters.

The carp-removal operations serve a two-fold purpose for, while the netting is going on, a Department biologist is present and counts the number and size of the species of fish that are caught and this way a rough idea of a lake's fish population and other valuable data is ascertained. The game fish are returned alive to the water.

The Department's war against the carp has increased over the years: In 1947 a total of 400 pounds was removed from Lake Scugog while the following year well over four-and-a-half tons were taken. Last year operations extended to Sturgeon Lake as well and from that body of water and Lake Scugog, a total of 11 tons 300 pounds was netted.

Latest additions to the expanding list of canned items range from live lobsters and whale steak to frozen lemonade, according to the American Can Company. Another potential field may be indicated by the "canning" of such things as explosives, electrical instruments, and drills, the company says.
