### Strike Delaying Local Shipments

While the current rail strike has not effected Stouffville so far as food stuffs are concerned, certain local concerns have had shipments curtailed. Cement, which is in short supply is being held up, and one local dealer tells us that they are two thousand bags behind.

While the rails at the local depot are rusting, orders for distant points are piling up at the Gold Fish Supply Co. plant. Some shipments are being made to Toronto by transport.

Stouffville has been serviced during the strike by two mails per day, via mail transport from Toronto. However, only first class mail is carried, principally letters, and mail couriers have had a light time of it. Rural route two out of Stouffville which is one of the heaviest has been delivering as little as five pounds a day, normally a hundred to a hundred and fifty pounds.

The Tribune this issue is also resorting to transport for delivery.
