At the moment, there are a dozen trained operators who are giving their time without renumeration to put on prorams for any interested roup in the township.

In addition to the above films, there are thousands of other 16 mm. films available 'for rental' for a very small fee. These films must be looked in advance as they must be ordered from other libraries in Guelph, Toronto and Ottawa.
