Convict Two More in Vaughan Township **Building Charges**

Two more cases of infractions of building and residential by-laws in Vaughan Township were dealt with last week when, in York County police court, Magistrate O. M. Martin levied fines of \$10. each and costs against the defendants. Another case was remanded to November '21' for hearing.

Two charges were laid in one case, one of occupying a garage as residence for two years, the other of adding an extension without a permit. Suspended sentence was given in the second charge with a \$10 fine in the first.

In the second case the charge was that of occuping a basement as a dwelling and \$10 fine was imposed in this case also. Giving evidence Township Building In-spector H. C. H. Miller disclosed that numerous warnings had been given in both cases and that efforts had been made to have those charged comply with township by-

Thieves Abandon **Equipment When** Alarm Goes Off

Evidently frightened away when they touched off the burglar alarm robbers, who broke into the Canadian Bank of Commerce branch in Brooklin some time during Wednesday night, failed to get anything. It was the fourth time in the last five years that attempts have been made to rob the bank. All have been unsuccess-

Wesley Piatti and Geoffrey Bailey, who live in a store about 100 yards from the bank, heard the burglar alarm siren blow but did not notify police. They explained that the siren "goes every time the lights flicker" and so many false alarms have been sounded that nobody in the willage pays any attention to it any more.

An unidentified Uxbridge man returning from work about four o'clock in the morning notified police when he noticed that the back door was open. .

The robbers had gained entrance by jimmying the lock on the rear door of the bank. They also jimmied the lock on an inner door. It is believed that they started the siren when they tried to cut the padlock off the alarm box with a pair of bolt cutters. They also used the bolt cutters

to cut the telephone wires leading into the bank before they entered. The robbers left all their tools behind the bank when they made their getaway. These included an acetylene welding unit, two jimmie bars, the bolt cutter and! a large canvas with which they

intended to cover the glare from the welding torch. About two years ago, robbers made a similar attempt to rob the bank. On that occasion, they managed to set up their equipment
