Saunders Urges Santa Select 60-Cycle Gifts In Certain Districts

With Christmas a mere few
weeks away, Commission Chair-
man Robert H. Saunders urged
"Santa Claus" to select 60-cycle
electrical appliances and equip-
ment as Christmas gifts in dis-
tricts soon to be changed over
from 25 to 60 cycle supply. He
emphasized that this was particu-
larly important in districts that
were scheduled for the standardi-
zation program in late December,
January and February because the
inventory of customers' equipment
in such sections already had been
taken.

Chairman Saunders pointed out
that if 25 cycle appliances were
purchased by Hydro customers in
these districts, this electrical
equipment would have to be
tagged out of service by the Com-
mission's technicians on "Cutover
Day" until the necessary materials
and parts could be obtained to
make the changeover. Even if re-
ported to the Hydro Frequency
Standardization office at the time
of purchase, the necessary parts
for the alteration work could not
be obtained at once, and the cus-
tomer would not have the service
of the new appliance for some
time. He referred to such items
as electric refrigerators, washing
machines, automatic ironers and
record players.

The Hydro Chairman suggested
that customers in these areas who
were planning to buy electrical
appliances should check with their
local appliance dealers. He said
that dealers have been most co-
operative and helpful in advising
customers to wait for and buy 60
cycle appliances in districts where
the frequency standardization pro-
gram was rapidly approaching.

Districts where the standardi-
zation program would be in progress
in late December and early in the
New Year were listed as Mark-
ham town; part of Markham Rural
Operating Area supplied by Union-
ville Distribution Station; Rich-
mond Hill R.O.A. (Thornhill sec-
tion); Woodbridge R.O.A.; Bolton
and Woodbridge town in Area
"A"; Watford; Oil Springs R.O.A.;
Alvinston section; Alvinston;
Arkona; Forest R.O.A.; Theford;
and Forest in Area "B"; and a
large part of the city of London
in Area "C."

Hit by Car, Shot in Head Dog Climbs out of Grave

Chicago, Nov. 17—Three weeks
ago Brownie, a five-month-old pet
dog, was struck by an automobile,
shot in the head and buried.

Brownie refused to become
spirited at his run of bad luck.
He roused himself out of a shallow
grave to prove it.

He's back at his home in subur-
ban Calumet City looking and feel-
ing considerably better than he
was after his close brush with
death.

Brownie strayed into the home
of Albert Herman last September
and was promptly adopted by
Herman's four young children. He
was hit by a car last month.

Mrs. Herman, noting Brownie
was suffering, decided to put the
dog out of his misery. She asked
a neighbor to shoot Brownie. He
took the dog to a wooded area and
fired one shot at the animal's head.
Then he placed Brownie in a
shallow grave.

The next day, Mrs. Herman said,
Brownie showed up at her back
door—whining. She rushed him to
a veterinarian, who went to work
with penicillin, splints and other
equipment and soon had Brownie
patched up. Several days later
Brownie was back home.

The mercy bullet fired by the
neighbor ricocheted off Brownie's
thick but affectionate skull with-
out inflicting any serious injury.

Health Unit is Answer to Poor Rural Services

Condemnation of the inadequate
rural health services in Ontario
County was made last week by
Mrs. Alan Lishman of Pickering
speaking at a meeting of the Pick-
ering Township Federation of
Agriculture at Brougham. Backing
up her contentions with statistics,
she called for support from the
proper authorities toward estab-
lishment of the Health Unit sys-
tem of public health, as is now in
vogue in many Ontario counties.
"The child living in the country
is a handicapped child," said Mrs.
Lishman. "It is all very well to
talk about the benefits of the fresh

air and healthy life in the out-of-
doors but the facts are that proper
health services are being denied
to the large majority of children
in Ontario County."

"Continuing: "Part of the trouble
lies with the one-room school sys-
tem which cannot match the
advantage of the consolidated
schools. The Health Unit is the
answer. In Pickering Township
we are fortunate to have two
clinics but they are a great dis-
tance apart and those who do not
have proper transportation may
not get to them when they
should."

Mrs. Lishman went on to
explain the physical operation of a
Health Unit and how it gives a
complete health service to all
areas and all classes and ages of
children. The cost, per capita, is

very reasonable. The Health Unit
would be fully staffed.

"Pickering Township, which is
in a better position than other
townships, has one health nurse
to 9,000 people. Certainly that is
understaffed," Mrs. Lishman con-
cluded.

Other speakers at the meeting
were Cecil Belyea of the office of
the Ontario Federation of Agricul-
ture; Allan Downey of Myrtle who
reported on the meeting of the
County Federation. F. V. VonPills
presided while Alan Lishman car-
ried out the duties of secretary.
