Saunders Urges Santa Select 60-Cycle Gifts Certain Districts

With Christmas a mere few weeks away, Commission Chairman Robert H. Saunders urged "Santa Claust" to select 60-cycle electrical appliances and equipment as Christmas gifts in districts soon to be changed over from 25 to 60 cycle supply. He emphasized that this was particularly important in districts that were scheduled for the standardization program in late December, January and February because the Ph. Agin. 201w2 Ph. 
