The greater part of the contest was a nip and tuck battle with neither club having too great an advantage in territorial play although the Clippers displayed more polish around the opposition's net. It was the first shut out performance for the local squad this season and goal-tender Eatough earned his no goal effort with a neat pick stopping exhibition in the Clipper cage.

Bob Bangay tallied the only goal in the first period to put the homesters in the lead when he took a pass from Ronnie Bell in front of the Newmarket net.
