John W. MacRae Born at Whitevale

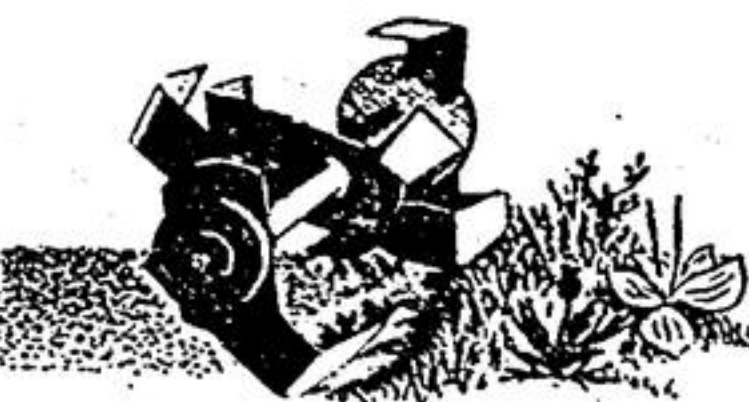

Youth Caravan Visits Toronto East Rural Presbytery

Their trip is a project of the National Young Peoples Union and the Board of Christian Education. Over 20,000 miles have been travelled and contact made with some 700 young peoples groups. In April they are starting to cover the southern part of Toronto Conference making their visit to Toronto East Rural Presbytery on April 4th at a banquet at Locust Hill United Church. When the Ontario tour is completed they will travel on to the East Coast.

One of the members of the Caravan is very well known to local residents. She is Evelyn Lapp of Cedar Grove, who is Recreation

and Culture Convener on the National Y.P.U. Executive. Rev. Bob Morris and Rev. Lloyd Shorten, Youth Workers at the United Church Publishing House, and Helen Clark, Past-President of Toronto Conference Y.P.U., all of whom have made the entire trip so far, and a representative of Toronto Conference will comprise the remainder of the group.

This will truly be an inspirational evening with singing, worship, discussion and recreation and an opportunity to learn of youth work across Canada. An invitation is given to older people to attend as it is not limited to the young people. Indeed, older members of the congregations in the East Rural Presbytery are especially invited.
