Voters Defeat School Area Division Plan

A proposal to divide School Area 3 in Pickering Township into two school sections was defeated Monday night by a vote of the ratepayers meeting in Rouge Hill public school.

It had been suggested that the school area be divided with students living north of No. 2 Highway attending Rouge Hill school and students below the highway going to a new \$80,000 four-room school on Rosebank Rd.

Members of the school board said the tax rate for the undivided area would be 22 mills this year. If split in two, it would be 28 mills for the north and 34 mills for the south.
