### Light Vote on Marketing Scheme For Poultrymen

The voting on the proposed marketing scheme for eggs, which was held last Thursday. Friday and Saturday, was reported to be extremely light in this district. Results of the province-wide vote are expected to be released from Toronto within the next week.

The light vote was said to be reflected across the province. Sponsored by the Federation of Agriculture, the vote was taken under the provincial farm pro-ducts marketing act. It would, if it carries, clear the way for the establishment of an egg marketing scheme by producers which would give them control of the market-

ing of their eggs.

The vote was sought as a worsening export situation indicated a growing surplus of eggs with a resulting reduced domestic prices. Poultry men are cut off from U.K. markets because of the international exchange situation, and exports are well down to the United States because of growing domestic production there.

There was no indication of how the vote would go. Generally, a high majority is required to establish a marketing scheme because of the widespread effect on farm practices. In view of the light vote, supporters of the scheme are not optimistic. While a unmarket ballot does not mean a "no" ballot, as in other votes, the fact that so few poultry growers voted will count strongly in the final decision.

Many poultry men confessed an ignorance of the exact workings of the marketing scheme although organizers of the vote have held Dr. Horace Bascom, Ontario's many meetings to discuss the
