

# Community Aids in Arbor Day Clean Up

A few days ago Miss J. As the bright morning sun cast its rays over the country side, the noise of tractors and implements could be plainly heard wending their way towards the school. Farmers with shovels and spades slung over their shoulders rallied to the support of the teacher and pupils in an effort to change the uneven landscape into a smooth level playground.

Quickly the power units started to work, with one dual-wheeled tractor equipped with a blade and hydraulic shovel and driven by Allan Hoover began terracing the front section of the yard while another unit dragged away fallen tree limbs. The Chairman of the Public School Area Board, Mr. Wm. Hewlett joined in the manual labor along with the other workers in the beautification project. During the operation, Miss Gregg and her pupils were far from idle as they raked and gathered up the fallen leaves and dead grass for burning. In commenting to the teacher on the large scale project we mentioned that we had never witnessed such a scheme carried out by a district before.

"You don't know what a wonderful community this is," was Miss

behind the wheel and putting the tractor through its paces. Cy calls them "prove-to-yourself" demonstrations, feeling that the right place for a farmer to choose his tractor is right in the tractor seat.

The McCormick W-4 is the smallest of a series of five standard tractors built by International Harvester. Its fully governed engine has five forward speeds. It is said to plow up to twelve acres per average day or double-disk up to thirty acres. On the belt a W-4 will handle a 22-inch thrasher in average conditions, medium-size hammer mill or ensilage cutter.

"Hydraulic remote-control of all pull-behind is available for the W-4 as optional equipment," says Cy. This modern device, operated from the tractor seat, raises, lowers and regulates implements on the drawbar, without even slowing down the machine. A light pull or push of handy control rod by the tractor operator is all that is required to make the required adjustment.

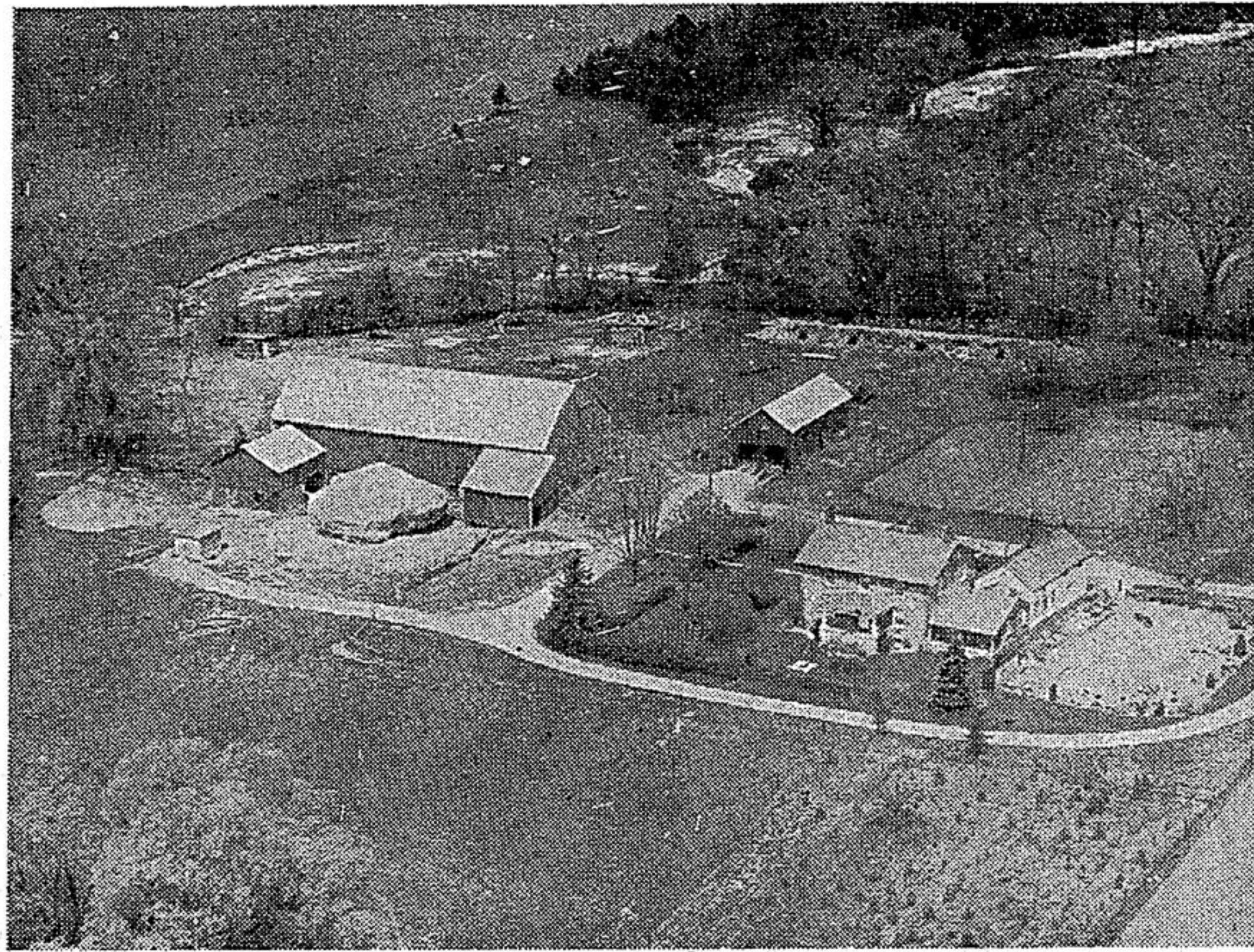

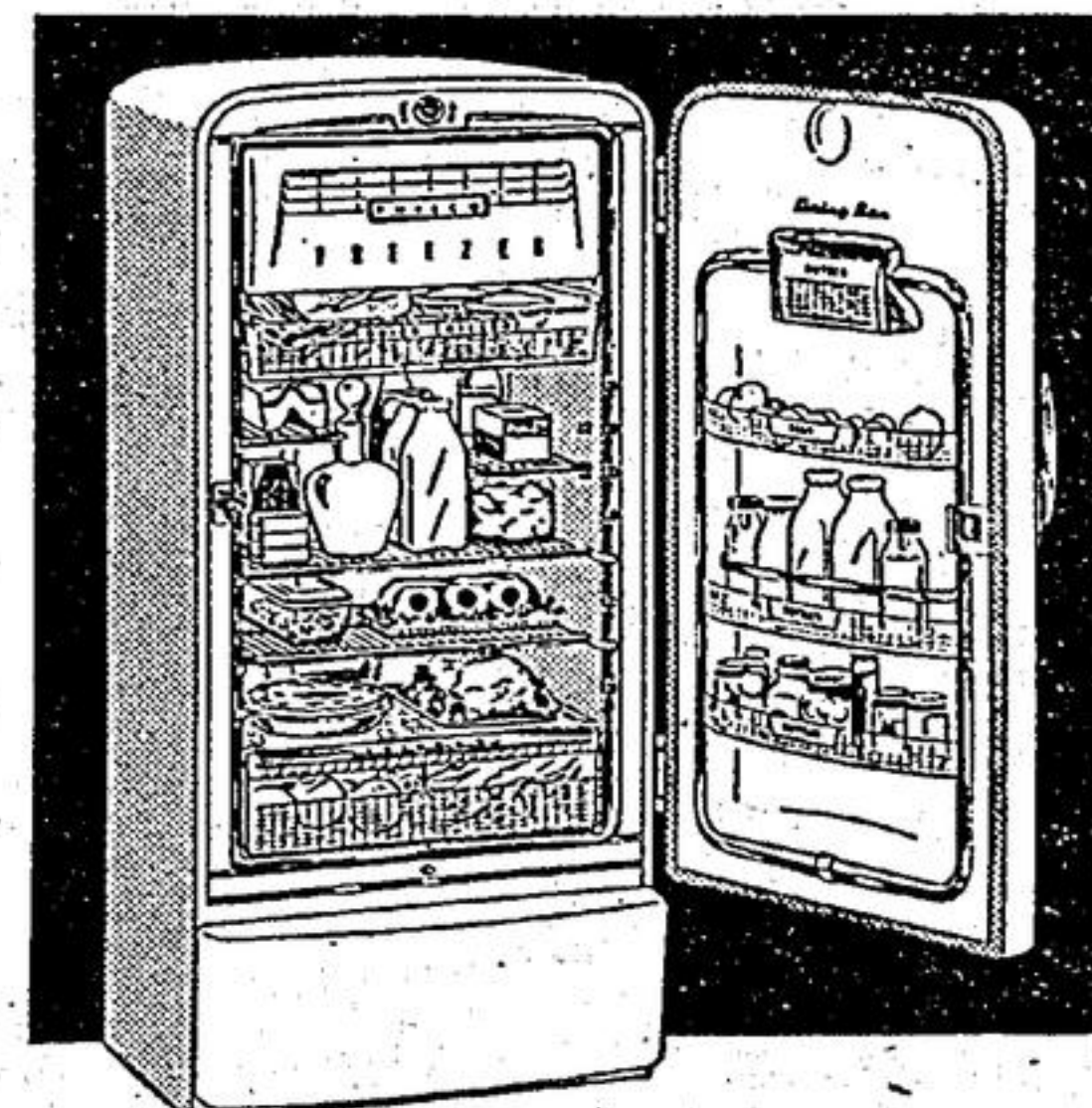

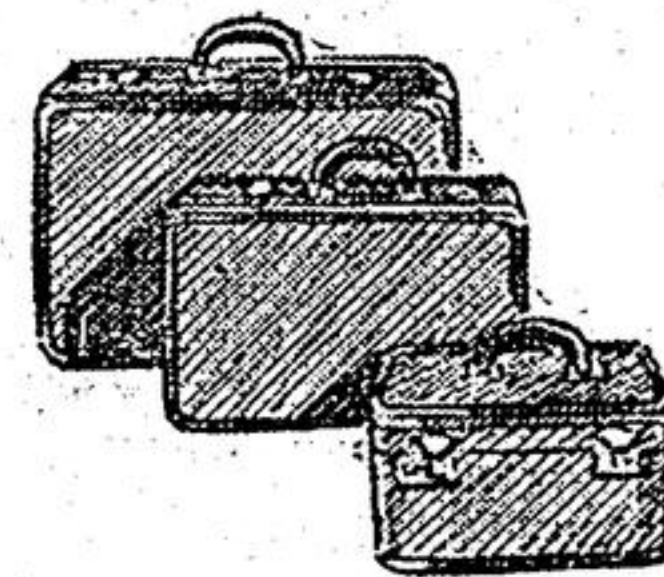
