## THIS WEEK'S SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

### CONSERVING THE FAMILY HERITAGE

**Golden Text**—Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee.—Exod. 20:12

### THE LESSON AS A WHOLE

Approach to the Lesson

The Fifth Commandment, which stands at the head of our lesson this week, is generally regarded as the first of the second table of the Law, because it is the first Commandment dealing with our duty to men. A more ancient division, however, made this the last of the first table, and there is a very real connection between the first four and the Fifth. Our parents stand as representatives of God to us until we come to a personal knowledge of God. They stand in the place of God to us, until we learn, through reverence for them, reverence for God. If parents more generally realized this, there would be more dignity and decorum in the family circle, and they would seek, by godly example and godly discipline, to lead the children to the fear of God through filial obedience and honor.

It is rather remarkable that in Leviticus 19:3 the Fourth and Fifth Commandments are brought together in one: "Ye shall fear every man his mother, and his father, and keep my sabbaths: I am the Lord your God." Duty to God stands closely linked with duty to parents. Our parents would seem to be the connecting link between our duty to God and our duty to our fellows. These two Commandments, which are so closely linked, are the only ones of the Ten expressed in positive form. All the others are: "Thou shalt not."

The morality of a nation depends upon the home. Where the home is pure and strong, national righteousness is high, but when the home begins to crumble, the whole national structure begins to disintegrate. We need to be much concerned for our land when we see the boasted American home in such jeopardy as it is today. With the marital bond snapping, parental authority breaking down, and filial reverence almost unknown, our national stability is at low ebb. Surely an awakening from God is needed to save us from destruction!

**Verse by Verse**  
Exod. 20:12—"Honour... that thy days may be long." Paul calls this "the first commandment with promise" (Eph. 6:2). It is the basis of national morality. Dis-

obedience to this command was punishable with death in Israel (Exod. 21:15, 17).

Mark 7:9—"Ye reject the commandment of God, that ye may keep your own tradition." Read the preceding verses for the occasion of this remonstrance. The tradition which the Pharisees were upholding was the ritual washing of hands, cups, pots, and so forth, which to them was no matter of simple hygiene, but of religious observance. The Lord accuses them of actually setting aside divine commandments in favor of their own traditions, and proceeds to give an example.

Verse 10—"For Moses said," Moses was the bearer of the oracles of God. Theoretically the Pharisees paid profound respect to Moses, but practically they exalted their own devices. The two quotations from Moses in this verse are Exodus 20:12; 21:17. Smiting and reviling a parent were capital crimes.

Verse 11—"But ye say, If a man shall say... Corban." "Corban" is the word used for "oblation" in the Old Testament, and signifies whatever has been presented as an offering to God in order to obtain favor of Him. The Lord exposed the hypocrisy of putting to religious uses what ought rightly to have gone to the support of needy parents.

Verse 12—"And ye suffer him no more to do ought for his father or his mother." This is what made their rule so cruel and obnoxious. Once the oath of Corban was taken, the ill-advised person was bound to withhold all benefits from his parents, however needy, and give to the Temple. This was a blatant breach of the Fifth Commandment.

Verse 13—"Making the word of God of none effect... and many such like things do ye." How the clear, pure Word of God suffers at the hands of its would-be interpreters! Christ indicates that the case He cites is only an example of multiplied abuses, where the whole purport of the Law has been destroyed by the accumulation of human additions.

John 19:25—"Now there stood by the cross of Jesus his mother." What a change of atmosphere from the last passage! The ever-faithful (though not always understanding) mother is with her ever-faithful Son in the hour of His suffering. Doubtless she had come to Jerusalem for the Passover, according to custom (Luke 2:4). There were other Marys with her, sharing the bitterness of that hour (Mary means marah, bitterness).

Verse 26—"Woman, behold thy

here would be understanding and faith and love and sympathy, which His unbelieving brothers could not give. What an example is this for every Christian! The lack of filial piety is a serious defect in the character, and is likely to mean breakdown all the way.

Verse 27—"Behold thy mother!" In this gracious way our Lord charged His beloved disciple with the care of this dearest of all women. It was to be no cold charity, but a mother-son relation. So, in the midst of His anguish, Jesus discharged His filial duties, but as a matter of love, not of Law. How long Mary remained with John we do not know—perhaps till her own sons came to the faith, perhaps till her death.

### The Heart of the Lesson

The place given in the Decalogue to the command to honor our parents indicates the importance of this duty in the eyes of God. If we regard it as the first of the second table, then it stands supreme in all the moral Law. If we accept the older division, and see it as the last of the first table, its dignity is still greater, in that it stands even more closely linked with our duty to God Himself. Then again it is unique in that a promise is linked with it. Filial piety is a mighty bulwark of strength and endurance to any nation. On the other hand, that nation is already in process of break-up where parental honor is on the wane. It is amazing that in the general depravity of Judah in the days of Jeremiah, one family was found who honored their father Jonadab by obedience to his commandment, and, with national judgment looming, this promise was given to that family, "Jonadab the son of Rechab shall not want a man to stand before me for ever" (Jer. 35:12-19). The judgment upon the Jews pronounced by our Lord, and fulfilled in A.D. 70, fell upon a generation which practiced pious hypocrisy to cover their lack of duty to their parents (Mark 7:9-13).

### CINNAMON SANDWICH BISCUITS

Mix and sift once, then sift into a bowl, 2 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 1 1/4 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 3 teps. Magic Baking Powder, 3/4 tsp. salt and 1/4 c. fine granulated sugar. Cut in finely 4 lbs. chilled shortening. Combine 1 well-beaten egg, 1/2 c. milk and 1/4 tsp. vanilla. Make a well in dry ingredients and add liquid; mix lightly with a fork, adding milk if necessary, to make a soft dough. Knead for 10 seconds on lightly-floured board and roll out to 1/4" thickness; shape with floured 1 1/4" cutter. Cream together 1 1/4 lbs. soft butter or margarine, 1/4 c. lightly-packed brown sugar, 1/2 tsp. grated orange rind and 1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon. Using only about half of the creamed mixture, place a small spoonful of the mixture on half of the cut-out rounds of dough; top with remaining rounds of dough and press around edges to seal. Spread biscuits with remaining creamed mixture and arrange, slightly apart, on greased cookie sheet. Bake in hot oven, 450°, about 12 minutes. Serve warm. Yield—16 biscuits.
