

# Local Son Returned From Korea Discloses Red Propaganda Methods

**Christmas Cards From Chinese People's Volunteers, Propaganda Leaflets, Classical Music Over Radio and "Advice" From Airplanes Equipped With Loudspeakers.**

Among the hundreds of returning veterans of the Korean War welcomed home recently at the Union Station was a local Danforth resident, Lt. Fred Pugh, M.M., of "B" Co., 2nd R.C.R., residing at 178 Hampton Avenue, Toronto. The family were former east-end residents of Stouffville. Fred enlisted in the Special Force on Aug. 11, 1950, and the following month arrived at Fort Lewis, Washington, where intensive combat training was carried out prior to proceeding overseas to Korea. Fred speaks highly of the hospitality and entertainment and courtesies extended to our boys at Fort Lewis and the many efforts made by local residents to assure our boys they were still "at home" and among friends.

In April, 1951, the regiment embarked for Korea where they landed May 4 and May 19 found them in the Assembly Area. The regiment went into action in the western section of Korea on May 24 (Queen Victoria's birthday, which we have just celebrated here in Canada). Both in the U.S.A. and Korea our troops were

fed on U.S. Army rations which Fred says were "good." Communist propaganda directed to our troops in Korea is intensive. Via the radio our boys are subjected to the dulcet voice of "come hither" Rose of Peking and classical music. Up the line they are showered with the leaflets and cards, a sample of which, in color, shows a family preparing to sit down to a table on which is a roast turkey and other food and on the opposite page a picture, supposedly one of our boys holding in his hand what might be a can of pork and beans. Under these pictures are various comments, one of which reads: "It's no disgrace to

quit fighting in this unjust war." If you "forgot" to send a card to your boy in Korea last Christmas don't feel too badly about it for he received one from the Chinese People's Volunteers extending greetings and with the following piece of "advice":  
Whatever the colour, race or creed,  
All plain folks are brothers indeed,  
Both you and we want life and peace.  
If you go home, the war will cease.  
Demand Peace!  
Stop the War!  
Chinese airplanes equipped with

loudspeakers also hand out "advice" to our boys. Compare this Communist propaganda with the lackadaisical air of Ottawa and the CBC which charges you \$2.50 for a radio license and hopes soon to assess you \$15 per year for your T.V. set.  
Approved by his late Majesty King George VI, Fred Pugh was decorated with the Military Medal by the Hon. Brooke Claxton, Minister of Defence, when he visited our troops in Korea. Fred had little to say as to the reason why he received his M.M., but the official citation speaks for him. At that time Fred was a private. The citation reads as follows:

"Private Pugh, 2nd Battalion, the Royal Canadian Regiment, showed initiative and extreme courage, far beyond the call of duty on 3 October, 1951. Private Pugh, a signaller with "B" Company was left at the Company Firm Base during an attack on a strongly held enemy position on the Naech'on feature, Korea. He listened to the messages being passed by his Company in the early stages of the battle. Shortly thereafter, the Company came under intense mortar and shell fire and he heard no further messages being passed. Private Pugh rightly assuming that the signaller with the Company Commander had become a casualty, without waiting for instructions, proceeded forward under intense enemy (continued on page 3)

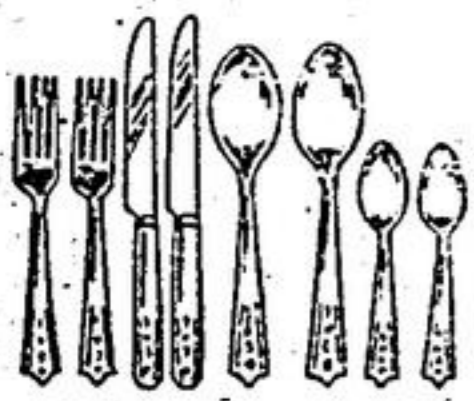

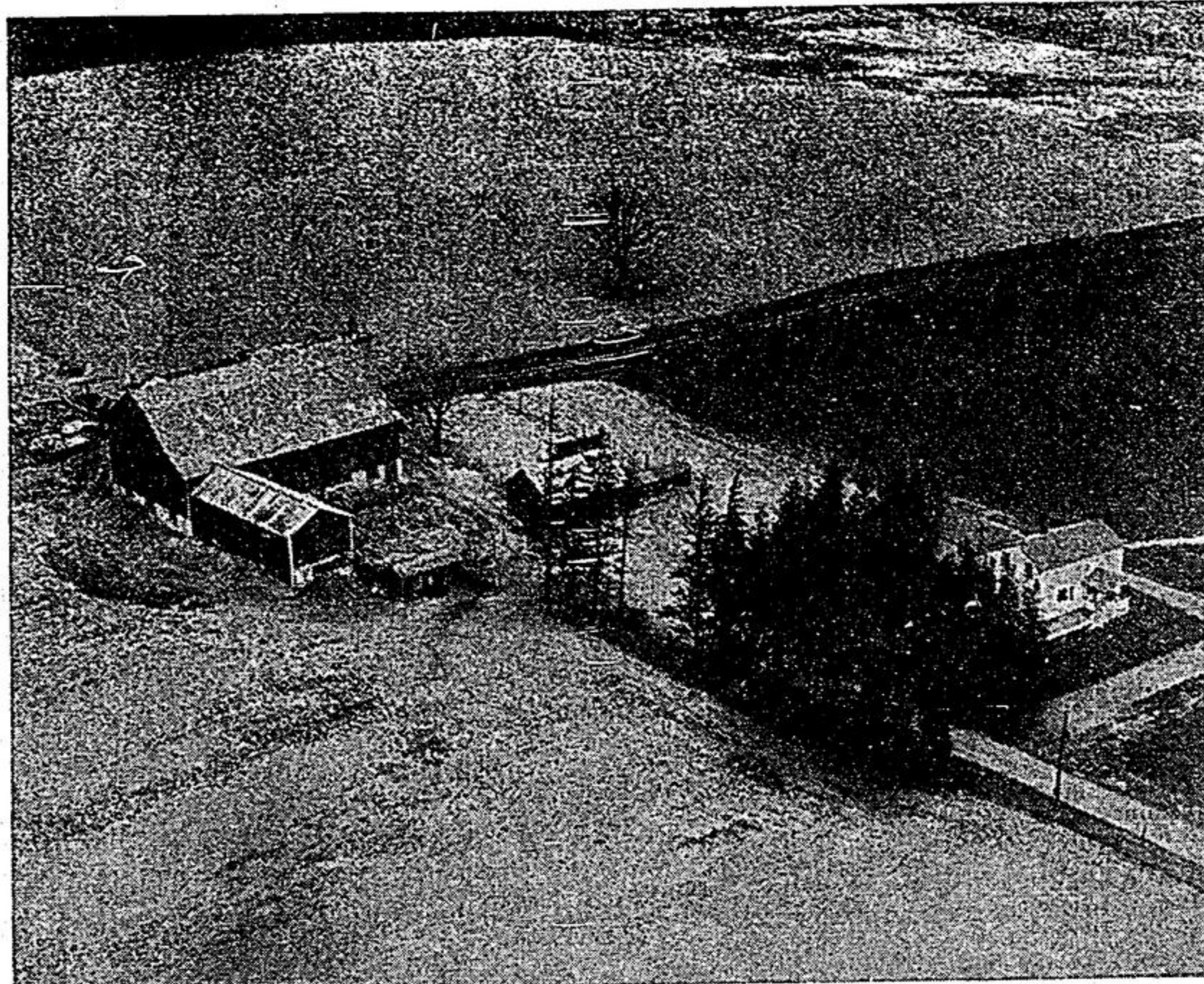

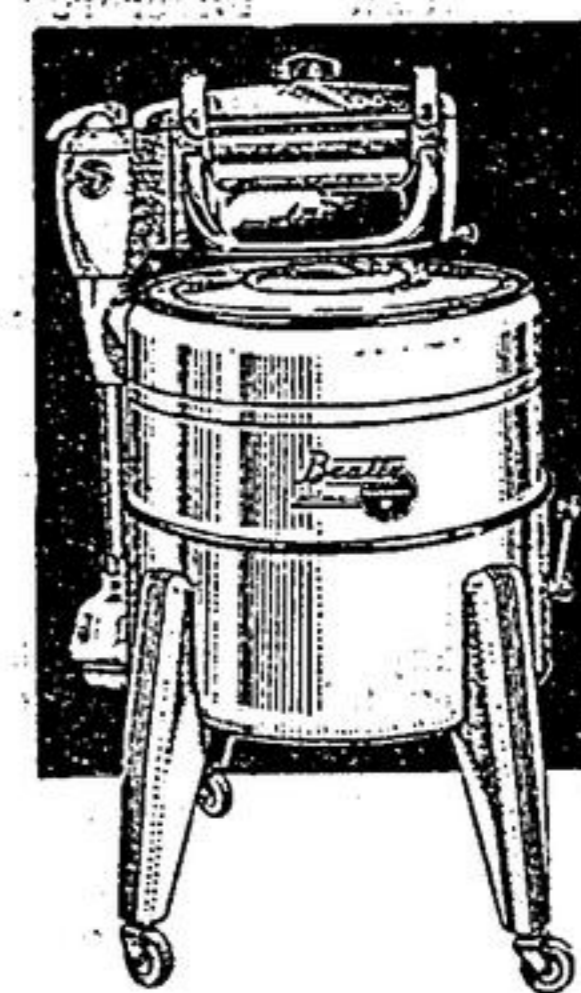
