Horticultural Notes

The series of colored movies and slides presented by Mr. Glenn Ratcliff on the 9th, 16th and 23rd of June in the auditorium of the United Church and recording many of the highlights of his recent tour of the Mediterranean and continental countries was concluded on Monday evening last. A very large audience heard Glenn's vivid description of the latter portion of his journey which proceeded through northern Italy, Switzerland, France and Holland, then across the channel to England and Scotland. The mountains and lakes of the Alpine country, the scenes in and about Paris, the enchanting flower-bedecked landscapes of Holland, lovely pastoral views and historical landmarks of England and the rugged beauty of old Scotland brought back memories of home to many in the audience.

The views were interspersed with music in song by a trio consisting of Norman Farr, Lawrence Barkey and David Ratcliff.

On behalf of the Horticultural Society Mr. Lloyd Weldon presented to Mr. Ratcliff three rolls of colored film in appreciation of his valued contribution, and to Rev. D. Davis, for the Board of the United Church, a cheque in recognition for graciously granting the use of the auditorium.

Mr. Ratcliff has consented to show his pictures of scenes in Greece and the Holy Land sometime later in the season.

Agincourt Churches Oppose Golf Club Request for Liquor

Congregations of three churches in Agincourt have joined in a protest against the application for a liquor license by the nearby Tam-O-Shanter Golf Club on the Kennedy Rd.

Members of Knox United, Knox Presbyterian and St. Timothy Anglican Churches intend to appear at the public hearing of the Liquor Control Board of Ontario, June 27, in an attempt to block the move.

Officials of the club counter charges that liquor would be sold indiscriminately at the club by stating that it would be limited to members and their guests only.

The formal protest drawn up by the three churches and signed by the majority of their congregation states:

"We are of the opinion that if the community were canvassed, the application for liquor for the Tam O-Shanter Golf Club would be strongly opposed.

"The liquor outlet is for non-residents who drive to and from the golf club on two major highways leading from Toronto. The menace of the drinking driver on

these highways in regard to accidents and especially to the children whose homes are near the highway would be increased.

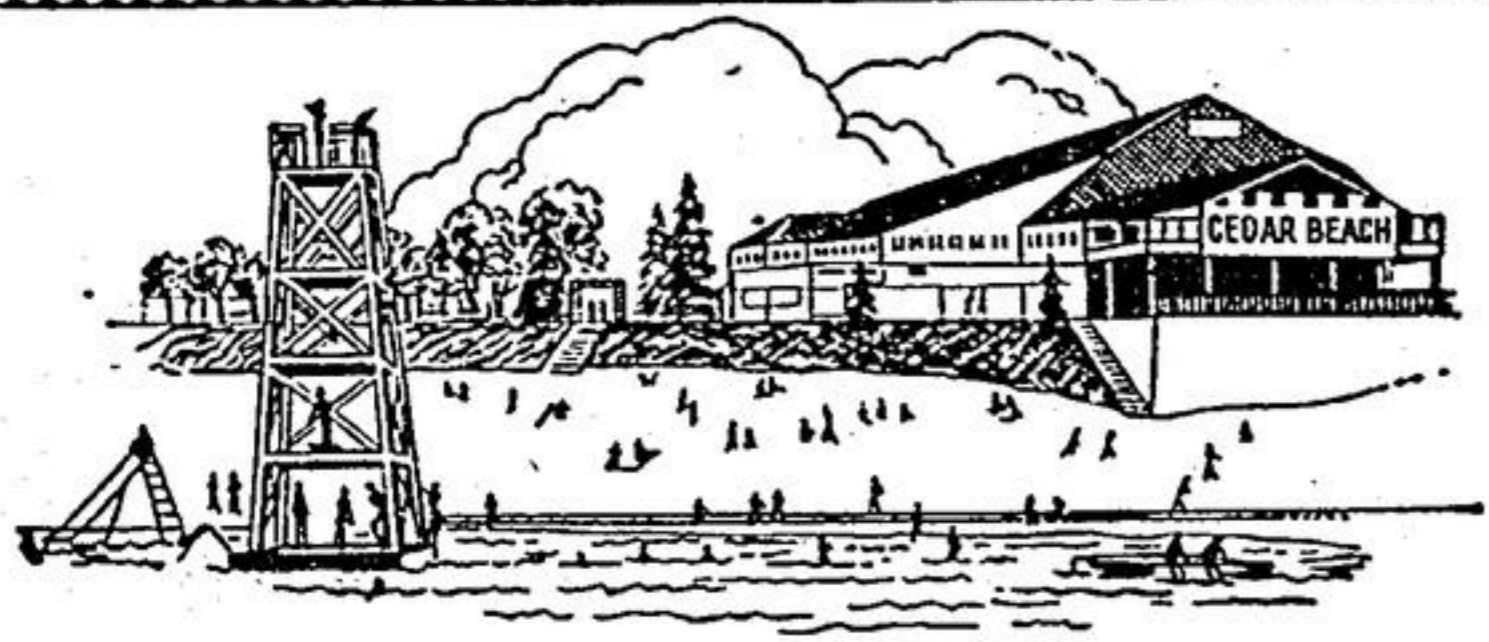
"We are strongly of the opinion that the granting of this license would have a most undesirable influence on the youth of our community."
