No Decision on Vacancy in Markham Court of Revision

At Monday's Markham Township Council meeting the members passed a motion approving of the T.T.C. suggested new schedule of fares for the North Yonge Bus Line.

The North York transportation system is operated by the T.T.C. for the Municipalities of North York Township, Markham Township, Vaughan Township, and the village of Richmond Hill. On recommendation of Mr. H. W. Tate, Assistant General Manager of the T.T.C., the municipalities sometime ago agreed to increased rates effective September 8th in order to overcome a steadily mounting deficit. The Councils of North York and Richmond Hill have already passed resolutions approving of the increase.

Mr. LeMasurier asked Reeve Timbers to suggest to the municipalities concerned that they consider the possibility of offering the contract for operating the bus line to somebody else besides the T.T.C. Councillor Lennie felt the sum of 45 cents a ride charged to operate a T.T.C. bus was a "little high". Deputy-Reeve James and Councillor Hooper contended if it ever came down to vote the people would certainly prefer the T.T.C.

to another line. The members gave consideration to the appointment of a replacement to the Townships Court of Revision. The recent resignation of Ex-Reeve and Court Chairman Wes Gohn due to poor health, has necessitated the appointment of a new member. The members of this Court of Revision which handles local improvements and Assessment Appeals, when appointed hold office indefinitely until the council replaces them. At present the membership of the Court is composed of W. Gohn, W. J. Spears, J. Reesor, W. Dean, and F. Brumwell. Reeve Timbers suggested the name of W. J. Spears as the new chairman and W. L. Clark as the new member. Both Councillors LeMasurier and Lennie felt any such Court should be representative in nature and if possible include, a farmer, a homeowner, an engineer, a real estate man, and an architect. Councillor Hooper main-

tained the present Court represents a cross section of the community. Councillor Lennie was agreeable to have W. J. Spears appointed as Chairman but felt the new member should come from a non-farm area. However, no decision was reached and the matter was left open for further consideration.

On motion of Deputy-Reeve James and Councillor Hooper council decided to extend the deadline for the submission of tenders covering the construction of the new township offices at Buttonville from August 15th to August 18th. Councillor A. Lennie claimed it has been brought to his attention a hardship is being worked on township employees in so far as they often have to wait several days beyond the end of the month before receiving their salary cheques. "I can see," stated Mr. Lennie, "where expense accounts require council approval before payment but salary cheques should be issued on the last day of each month regardless." Reeve Timbers promised to speed up the issuing of salary cheques to township employees. The township will be represented at the Police Convention to be held in Winnipeg during September by Police Chief Clarence Wideman.
