Uxbridge Township Council expressed grave concern over the cost of fire protection for the township from outside brigades.

"We will have to zone the township for fire protection and if any resident over a certain line puts in a call to the Stouffville brigade he must bear the cost," claimed Clerk John Ashenhurst.

The Uxbridge brigade work under a contract not to exceed \$500. They are paid a minimum of \$350 plus a dollar per man per fire. During the past month the Stouffville brigade was summoned to three separate fires which amounted to \$180.00. The cost of this service was billed to the township.
