**Can't Say Why He Burned Brougham Barn**

An 18-yr.-old boy who set a straw stack and barn afire near Brougham on Oct. 31st was unable to give court officials any explanation of why he committed arson. Ronald Moore was remanded in custody for another week for sentence. He appeared without counsel and without anyone to speak for him in court but was given a sympathetic hearing by Magistrate Ebbs and Crown Attorney Alex Hall in Whitby court.

Provincial Constable Gordon Keast gave evidence that the charge arose following a fire on the farm of Stuart Tweedie, lot 24, on con. 5, Pickering Township.

Moore lives with relatives in a rented house on the Tweedie property. In a statement to police, he admitted lighting a match for a cigarette and flicking the match into a straw stack along side the barn. When asked for a reason for this wilful action, he gave none and stated: "I just threw it in the stack. Then I went into the house and didn't say anything. I looked out the window and saw the fire. Then I called Anna and Edith."

They tried to douse the fire with a pail of water but were unsuccessful. When asked whether he knew that the barn would burn when he threw the match, Moore replied: "Yes." Loss was \$4,000.

There is no animosity between him and the owner of the barn, apparently. The background of the boy is unsatisfactory and he has a juvenile record. Though he is said to have been good at school, he himself denies it. Court officials asked questions to ascertain if he knew of a similar arson case not many miles away recently but he denied any knowledge of it. The reason for his act remained hidden.

**Goodwood Country Club Involved in Conspiracy Case**

Decision on whether or not there will be committal for trial by a higher court will be given by Magistrate Ebbs in Whitby court on Nov. 26th, in the case of Donald O. Lavis and Mrs. Verna Washburn, Toronto, charged with conspiring together to defraud the shareholders of the Goodwood Country Club. A. C. Hall, for the Crown, and S. Smithers for the defendants, presented their arguments to the court last week. Mrs. Washburn is also charged singly with selling the Howe property while knowing of the existence of an unregistered deed of prior sale. She elected trial by higher court.

At the preliminary hearing, evidence was that the club, being without funds to conclude the purchase of the Howe farm near Goodwood which it wished to add to its holdings, was told that Mrs. Washburn would advance the amount of \$1,443 to close the deal on the understanding that, in not less than six months, she would convey the property back to the club when it raised the money. In the meantime the Crown alleges, she sold the property to a Mrs. Turner, who was at first charged as a party to the conspiracy, but that charge was withdrawn.

Mr. Smithers contended that there was no conspiracy to defraud the other shareholders, (represented by Mr. Pritchard who laid the charge.) Mr. Smithers said that all that had been done could have been done without the knowledge of Dr. Lavis. Counsel admitted that the financial affairs of the club were in a confused state but when the property was optioned by Mrs. Washburn and transferred to Mrs. Turner there was no monetary consideration. Moreover that while there might be cause for a civil action by the club against Mrs. Washburn for specific performance, there is no evidence of a conspiracy.

Mr. Hall countered that the charge being heard is not one of defrauding the shareholders but of conspiracy and that it is possible for two persons to be guilty of conspiring under circumstances where if one person alone did the act, it would be no more than a civil action. The overt acts in the transactions are introduced as the evidence from which the conspiracy may be inferred.

In this case, Mr. Hall said, the Country Club had an equity in the Howe property. Mrs. Washburn advanced the money but before the time for recovery had expired

**Local Trees Among 2,000,000 Going to U.S.**

This Christmas 2,000,000 Canadian Christmas trees will decorate U.S. homes. R. Jones of Toronto said last week. Mr. Jones, who is general manager of the Canadian Christmas Tree Growers' Association, said that within the next few years Scotch-pine exports should blossom into a \$20,000,000 seasonal business. Several thousands of these trees come from the bushland of Uxbridge Township operated by Cec. Hendricks of Stouffville as a commercial forest.

Mr. Jones said that this Christmas would be the first time that sale of Scotch pines has been controlled by the association. Aim of the group is to ensure that all the trees are graded and selected as early as June for a fair cash price;

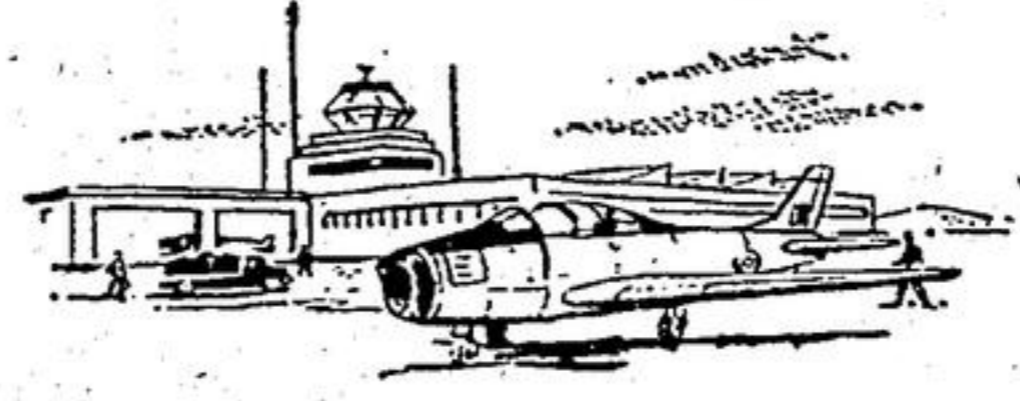
also to encourage investments in tree farms. Mr. Jones said 25,000 first grade Scotch pines would be available on the Ontario market within a few weeks. He said that trees in the city would be \$1.50 to \$5 each.
