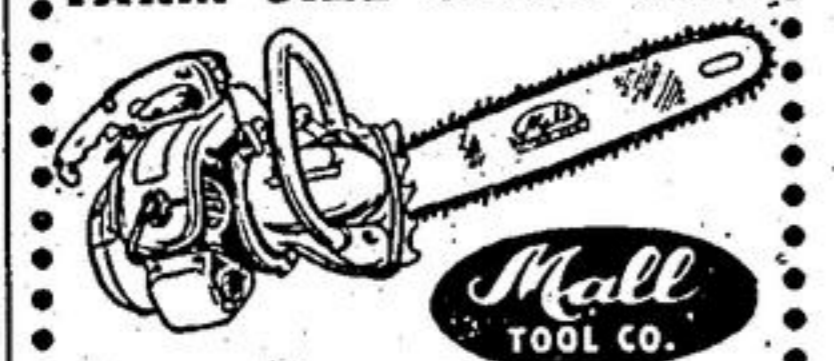
An outside chimney is being built on the north side of the township hall. This will do away with the long string of pipes inside.

Sixty Tons of Fowl at the Uxbridge Market, Prices Down

Santa Claus made his annual jaunt to Uxbridge Thursday and so did scores of district farmers who sold some 60 tons of yule fowl on the annual Christmas market. About 40 tons were sold last year.

While volume was up prices were considerably lower. Geese and turkeys were down about 10 cents a pound. Turkeys were selling at between 45 and 55 cents per pound; capons 47 to 53 cents; chickens 45 to 51 cents; ducks 32 to 40 cents and geese 34 to 36 cents.

"There was a good auction and a lot of buyers. The weighing scales were kept on the go continually throughout the morning," Lynn Fair, district representative of the Department of Agriculture, said.

An exhibition of dressed poultry and eggs was held in the town hall. Bryce Parks of Cannington walked off with most prizes. E. L. Hook of Greenbank captured the major prize for his display of a five-dozen lot of eggs.

Marlene Forsythe, 15, was chosen Snow Queen of the fair.

Children of the village and district were given a half day holi-

day to greet Santa. He handed out 1,250 bags of candies.

The parade, one of the best staged, included a dozen or so gaily decorated floats. Later, kiddies were guests at the theatre. Events of the day were under the sponsorship of the Uxbridge Kinsmen Club.
